Matthew Compton

Matthew Compton, a native of Colorado Springs, has been composing, arranging, and conducting music for handbells since 2007 when he was in the eighth grade. He had his first composition published at the age of fifteen, making him one of the youngest published handbell composers. Matthew graduated from Concordia University Wisconsin with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music with an emphasis in Composition and Conducting.

Based out of Vancouver, Washington now, he is the music director of the Bells of the Cascades in Portland, Oregon, Director of Music Ministries at Salmon Creek Church in Vancouver, and recently has become the new Artistic Director of Pikes Peak Ringers in Colorado Springs, CO. In addition to being a guest clinician at handbell festivals across the country, his music is frequently used at local and national handbell festivals, like the Bay View Week of Handbells and Distinctly Bronze East and West. He has been the recipient of the Donald E. Allured Composition Award.

In his limited spare time, Matthew can occasionally be found streaming a variety of games and music performances on Twitch, going hiking, or enjoying any number of movies, anime, or TV shows!

Nexus Brass is the professional performing and education branch of Restoration Brass non-profit. Here are the players joining us today:

Glen Whitehead, trumpet. Glen Whitehead is an internationally-recognized award-winning trumpet artist and composer who stretches the music field exploring improvisational phenomena, interactive communication and environmental collaboration between living cultures, technologies and the natural world. Springing from the world of trumpet virtuosity, his creative work often explores instrumental and vocal music as immersive soundscapes, sonic theatre, installation, environmental exploration and cultural discourse to build compelling new interdisciplinary investigations across the arts and sciences.



James Liverman, trumpet. James Liverman is a trumpet player with over 28 years of experience. He has performed with numerous orchestras, wind ensembles and chamber ensembles throughout the United States and Europe. For the past 15 years, he has been serving in the United States Army Bands as principal trumpet for U.S. Army Europe Band & Chorus, the 4th Infantry Division Band, the 101st Airborne Division Band, and the 77th Army Band in Fort Sill, OK. He has also had the opportunity to perform as solo cornet and flugelhorn with the Western Missouri Brass Band, Fountain City Brass Band, and the Colorado Brass.



Sarah Ford, horn. Sarah Ford joined the Colorado Springs Philharmonic as Principal Horn in 2016. She has taught at CSU Pueblo since 2016 and at University of Colorado, Colorado Springs since 2017. Sarah earned her Master of Music from the Yale School of Music and her Bachelor of Music from Rutgers University. During her summers, Sarah has participated in the National Repertory Orchestra, Crested Butte Music Festival, the Pierre Monteux School, the National Music Festival, and the Kennedy Center Summer Music Institute. Sarah enjoys playing music of all styles and genres and enjoys teaching students of all ages and abilities!



Ryan van Gilder, trombone. Dr. Ryan Van Gilder is a lecturer at CSU Pueblo, teaching applied trombone lessons, directing the jazz studies program, and serving as the Brass Technical Advisor for the marching band. An active trombonist, Ryan performs regularly throughout Colorado as principal trombone of the Pikes Peak Brass Band and Boulder Chamber Orchestra, as well as numerous groups around the state. As an educator, Ryan has worked with schools and honor bands throughout Colorado. Ryan earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Iowa and holds master's and doctorate degrees from the University of Colorado.



Tim Hoffman, tuba. Eastman Tuba Artist Tim Hoffman has been heard in venues across the United States, the United Kingdom, Serbia, Slovenia, Belgium, Germany and France. While in Europe he was honored to have played at notable U.S. cemeteries such as Normandy, Meuse-Argonne, and Oise-Aisne. Tim has performed with many talented ensembles and musicians, including the U.S. Army TRADOC Band, the United States Army Band and Chorus Europe, the West Virginia Symphony Orchestra, Virginia Symphony Orchestra, Imperial Symphony Orchestra, London Symphony Orchestra, and the Count Basie Orchestra.



Kathryn Yuill, percussion. Kathryn Yuill is a percussionist with the United States Air Force Academy Band at Peterson SFB. She currently performs with Stellar Brass, Academy Winds, the Ceremonial Band, and the Concert Band. Originally from Wisconsin, she holds a BM in Music Performance from the University of Minnesota Twin Cities, and an MM in Music Performance from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. Kathryn was previously a member of the US Air Force Band of Mid America at Scott AFB, performing with the brass quintet, concert band, jazz ensemble, and top-40 ensemble.


