MAJOR CONCERNS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

There are no concerns. Tricia Mason was very helpful in providing the intake logs.

We recommend that Santa Rosa Police Department's officers and detectives continue to provide the community with ongoing violence and gang prevention and awareness trainings.

We commend the department for their prevention efforts, specifically the specially trained officers and detectives who teach the G.R.E.A.T. program (Gang Resistance Education and Training). This program allows officers and detectives the opportunity to work one on one with 4th and 5th grade students in the classroom for eight weeks.

Prevention and awareness programs are also taught during the Gang Prevention Awareness Month in September. The awareness training is focused on minors, parents and professionals in the community.

We recommend the SRPD continue to actively participate in the Santa Rosa Violence Prevention Partnership which includes community based organizations throughout Sonoma County, other city departments and probation to provide support, guidance and assistance to those who request or are referred to the partnership.
