Mary Sheridan, DVM, from Winthrop Veterinary Hospital will be on hand to vaccinate your dog or cat for \$15.00 for the vaccination. Cash only will be accepted. Please bring proof of vaccination to get a three-year vaccination. Cathy Cook, Town Clerk, will be available to register your dog. The license fee for neutered/ spayed dogs is \$6.00. Non-neutered/ non-spayed dogs are \$11.00. Cash and Check only will be accepted.

Absentee ballots will be available in October for the State Referendum Election on Tuesday November 5, 2019 at the Ladd Recreation Center; the polls will be open from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM. The Wayne Conservation Commission

Update on the Wilson Pond/House Road Property, October 15, 2019

Following up on the Town's decision to manage this 118-acre lot for conservation, the Select Board has asked the Conservation Commission to work on next steps. Currently the Commission is researching deeds and finding boundary lines and corners on the property in preparation for a boundary survey. The Commission is also inventorying natural and cultural values of the property. The Town Manager has developed an initial sketch of a plan for a proper parking lot and is now seeking cost estimates.

The Commission looks forward to keeping the public fully informed as work goes forward, and is looking for interested Wayne citizens to work on a management plan for the property. Once the management plan is completed, work will begin to make the property more usable by the public. If you'd like to help, please contact the Town Manager at 685-4983, or Ken Spalding at 685-9012. 2019 Library Auction: By the Numbers Compiled by Lynette Stinneford, Auction Team Chair

Once again the Library Auction was deemed a success, with regards to both funds raised and entertainment provided! Here is a little recap of the things we keep track of, notice and actually count. We had **176** items donated to the auction, plus many others that went into our Buy It Now department. We think of our buy it now as a heavily curated yard sale, with witty commentary. There is usually something you didn't know you needed and often something we aren't even sure of what it is!! **65** people made donations to the auction. The **8** member auction team contributed a total of **132** hours to set up and tend the auction. We had at least **513** visitors and, over the course of 10 days, they placed **538** bids!! Compared to last year, fewer visitors but more bids! This year there was some exciting back-and-forth at the conclusion, ending with the oval mirror winning the "most bids" category with 23 bids. The mirror also won the percent increase ending at 1200% increase! We are always surprised and delighted by the variety of items that show up for the auction, this year was no exception. There were beautiful handmade items, gently used objects and old family treasures, all of which have gone out into the world to bring joy to others and benefit our library. The bid items in the auction raised \$5,410.00, Buy It Now items added \$773.00, for a grand total of \$6,183.00. All of this goes into the operating budget of the library.

Thank you to all of the people who made donations, paid a visit and placed a bid. You helped make this year's auction a resounding success.

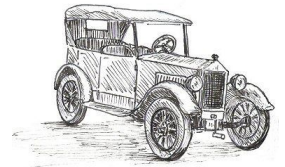
