Dear Friends & Neighbors,

By now, you're probably already full into the Christmas swing. If you're like me, you try to resist playing Christmas music until after Thanksgiving (like, the next day!). But there are many of us out there who could listen to Christmas carols and our old favorites all year long – and that's OK, too!

When I was in seminary, it was drilled into us that one should never sing Christmas carols before Christmas Eve. (But many of our carols contain the background information to Jesus' birth, too. So, if it brings you joy, I say, "Let those bells ring!") We were taught that too much of our world is consumed with a "gotta have it now" culture. That's true – in a world of same-day shipping and one-click ordering, we are accustomed to immediate gratification. I even find myself frustrated in the drive-thru lane at my favorite coffee spot if I don't get my order fast enough ("Isn't this supposed to be FAST food?"). It seems like as soon as Halloween is over the stores are stocking shelves and the Christmas ads are all over the TV and computer screens. The poor turkey doesn't even get its due!

There is a danger, though, in skipping over all the stuff that came before that miracle baby was born. Mary's turmoil at finding herself pregnant and running to her cousin's house (Elizabeth), only to find joy instead of disgrace.

The struggle Mary must have gone through building up the courage to tell Joseph about this baby that wasn't his. The struggle Joseph went through not wanting Mary to be punished, but also not sure about what to do with this unborn child that wasn't his. When we skip over Advent, we forget just how real and familiar their lives are to our own. But the miracle isn't as magnificent without all those background details – the joy is never as good as when we have to wait for something we truly desire. In fact, usually when there is a wait, we may even decide we don't want it as badly as we thought we did. Or maybe, we find out we're not quite ready to receive what we truly need.

By the time you receive this Messenger, Advent will have begun (check out the worship calendar for all the info about Advent and Christmas Eve). I hope you take the time to sit in the spiritual waiting room, maybe even read the first two chapters of Luke (they'll take you through Jesus' birth and childhood). The first two chapters of Matthew will give you more detail about Joseph's experience and take you through Epiphany (the coming of the Magi and the escape to Egypt). I invite you to find the joy in the day-to-day experience of this life, even in the waiting. In the words of Jesus, "I have said these things to you so that my joy will be in you and your joy will be complete" (John 15: 11). May it be so.

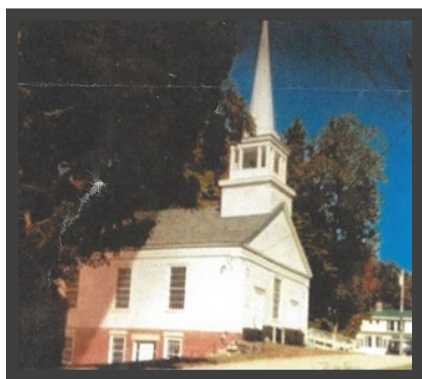

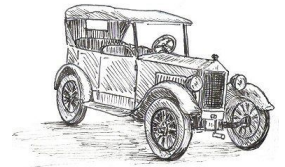
