Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Happy New Year! In the church calendar, January 6 is the day of the Epiphany (we celebrate on the closest Sunday) and marks the visit of the Magi to the Christ child. The word "epiphany" has lost some of its depth of meaning in our culture. When someone has an epiphany, it's like an "a-ha" or "eureka" moment – a moment of discovery. It could be something minute or it could be life-altering. In religious terms, an epiphany is the revelation of the divine – a sudden and profound understanding of the divine. That is no small event.

When the Magi from the East came to see the Christ child, their visit made clear several important revelations about God. First, that God came to earth to show God's love for all of creation, not just a select few. Second, it showed that God loves those of faiths other than the Abrahamic traditions and reveals divine knowledge to them, too. While some later traditions might have these "wise men" or "kings" returning to their homes as converts, I wonder what would they have converted to? There was no religious movement underway yet for them to follow (early Christians followed Jesus's teachings and were first known as "followers of The Way").

The Magi already knew the Hebrew Scriptures or they never would have known where the star was leading them, nor the prophecy that was being fulfilled. Yet, they weren't Jewish either. But in this child (probably 2 years old by then), they had seen something of God.

Through their journey, through their visit with Herod contrasted with the visit to a poor carpenter's home, through their dreams and visions of angels, they must have been changed. And that's the third revelation that God came in order to change the hearts and lives of people throughout the whole world – to change the world!

Whatever your faith tradition or belief system, I pray that this year, you receive a revelation of the divine. I pray that you recognize how beloved you are: to this community, to your family, to your friends, to God. I pray that we continue to journey together toward becoming our best selves – the people we were created to be. I pray that your year is filled with hope and promise. And may we be willing to change the world around us to reflect the love God shows us every day, in big and small epiphanies.

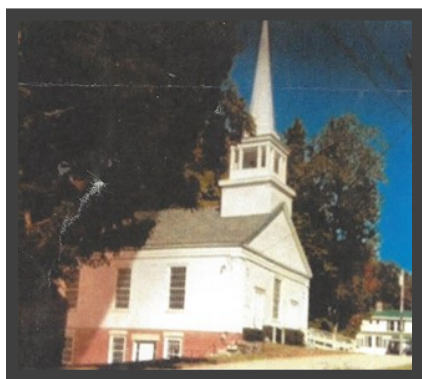

In observation of New Years' Day, Wednesday January 1st, 2020, the Town Office and Transfer Station will be closed.

This month the Planning Board will be meeting on Wednesday January 8, 2020, at 6:30 PM at the Wayne Town Office. At this meeting, the Planning Board will be holding a Public Hearing on the proposed amendments to our Zoning Bylaws which would allow the Maine Forestry Service to enforce timber harvesting in shoreline zone.

This month the Select board will be meeting on January 7 and January 14 at 6:30 PM at the Wayne Town Office.

The Select board will be holding a Special Town Meeting on Tuesday January 21, 2020, at 6:30 PM at the Ladd Recreation Center. The following articles on the warrant: 1) are an appropriation of funds from unassigned fund balance for sidewalk improvements in the village in conjunction with state road work on Route 133. 2) Proposed amendments to our Zoning Bylaws which would allow the Maine Forestry Service to enforce timber harvesting in the shoreline zone.

Your second installment of property taxes is due by Friday, January 31, 2020. Interest will begin to accrue on February 1, 2020, at 7% per annum.

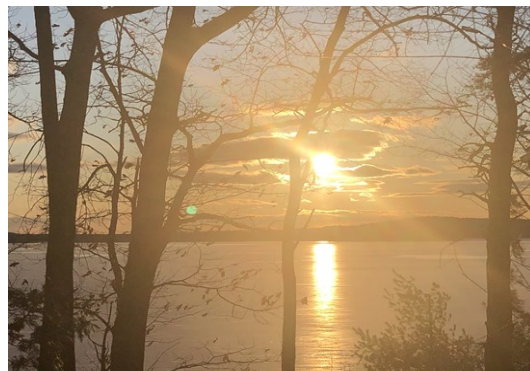

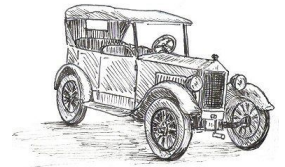
