Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Once upon a time, I lived in Houston. My apartment was in the Galleria district which meant I had to travel 30 minutes east (9 miles) to get to my graduate classes at U of H. Late at night, there wasn't much traffic on the streets heading to home, so it was usually a relaxing drive where I could unwind and reflect on the events of my day. One evening, I was running late. My routine interrupted, I found myself hurrying along those streets and not paying very close attention to my driving. As I pulled up to a four-way intersection, I slowed as there was a car stopped directly in front of me. As if in slow motion, I observed as they pulled into what seemed to be a clear intersection, only to see them get t-boned by someone who had thought they didn't need to stop. After making sure no one was hurt and after the police had arrived on the scene, I continued on my way. All I could think was, "Thank God for the interruption. If I had been on time, just a few seconds earlier, that might have been me."

Our Bible Study groups this Lenten season will be reading and discussing a devotional called "Interruptions" which uses Scripture, story and prayer to examine the ways that interruptions can change our lives. "Life is full of interruptions. Some are life-changing (and) may cause us to wonder, 'Where is God?' Other interruptions are minor, but they can frustrate us or leave us feeling out of control." This study invites us to look again at the interruptions in our days with curiosity. Jacob Armstrong writes, "Today will hold interruptions. We can count on it. Let's ask God to give us eyes to see these interruptions as opportunities the way Jesus did. The diversion could be an opportunity to stop and be present with someone else. The unwelcome intrusion might be an opening to experience life rather than rush through it. The interruption may be a chance to hear from God."

As we travel through this season of Lent together, preparing for the death and Resurrection of Jesus our Christ, may we give up some of the illusion of control we have over our lives and embrace the "random" opportunities for connection with God and with one another that disguise themselves as interruptions.

Wayne Democratic Caucus

March 8th Ladd Center - 2:30 to 5 p.m.

The Wayne Democrats are holding their Caucus on March 8th at the Ladd Center with the doors opening at 2:30 and the Caucus itself from 3:30 to 4:00. Following the caucus will be an hour from 4 to 5 for Democrats to propose and talk about their ideas for the coming year.

This year there is a Presidential Preference Election on March 3rd that will determine how the delegates to the National Convention are distributed. The purpose of the formal Caucus is to select delegates from Wayne to the State Convention in Bangor on May 29th. Delegates will be chosen "by candidate" for those who qualified for Maine's votes in the Primary, but this is a chance to choose delegates who will also advocate for a back-up candidate Y in the event candidate X is eliminated in the nominating process. The National Convention will be held in mid-July in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

The Democratic Caucus is open only to Democrats registered in Wayne. Voters who are registered as "Unenrolled" may join the Party between 2:30 and 3:30 p.m. The Wayne Town Clerk Cathy Cook will be present at that time. On April 4 we will feature a limited selection of home-made candies. Come early as our candies often sell out quickly!






