Dear friends and neighbors,

As I write today, I am sitting in a self-imposed quarantine until I can get a COVID-19 test. I traveled to Florida to help my mom who had surgery on her ankle and returned late on a Monday night. I went for the test on Tuesday morning but the doctor recommended I wait a week, otherwise there was a 40% chance for a false negative. It has meant sleeping in a separate room from my husband, using separate bathrooms, constantly disinfecting common surfaces, and masking whenever we are together. It has meant Dan had to do the grocery shopping and pick up the mail after working 8 hours and driving 300 miles. It has meant live-stream worship happening from home instead of the sanctuary and Hannah helping on a usual day off so that I don't need to go into the office to use the copier/printer. It has meant restless nights and concerned calls from family and friends. I was scared to get on those airplanes and to walk through those airports even though I was doing all I could to protect myself. I was scared because others were not doing all they could to protect me.

Fear is a natural human response to danger that serves to protect us. We are concerned about the health of an animal in the wild if it does not respond in fear to an encounter with a human. We cannot deny that fear exists nor that it is warranted with a pandemic that has killed half a million people around the world continues to plague us. But what is fear to a person of faith? The prophet Isaiah spoke these words from God, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41: 10, NIV).

Fear keeps us thinking that we are alone in our experience – yet did you hear how many people I encountered in that first paragraph: Dan, Hannah, Mom, family, friends, strangers. Now add God to that list – faith reminds us that we are never alone.

Fear keeps us thinking that we are helpless and weak – yet we have God given science to strengthen us. We know to wash our hands and wear our masks. We know to eat healthy food and get plenty of water. We know to get outside and move our bodies. All of these things assist our miraculously designed immune systems and keep us strong.

Fear keeps us thinking about only ourselves. Faith reminds us that God values righteousness which means loving our neighbor as we love ourselves. I mask to protect Dan because I love him. When we are working together, I mask to protect Hannah and she masks to protect me because we love each other. When I go into Hannaford in Winthrop, I wear a mask and I follow those arrows on the floor because I love the strangers and neighbors who work there and who shop there.

We can choose to live in faith AND wear a mask. So I leave you with a prayer by Barbara Glasson, president of the Methodist Conference, Britain as printed in *Sojourners magazine (June 2020):*

We are not people of fear: We are people of courage. We are not people who protect our own safety: we are people who protect our neighbors' safety. We are not people of greed: we are people of generosity. We are your people, God, giving and loving, wherever we are, whatever it costs, for as long as it takes, wherever you call us.

Our Town News

The Planning Board will be meeting on Wednesday, August 5, at 6:30 PM at the Town Office.

The Selectboard will be meeting on Tuesday, August 4, and August 18 at 6:30 PM remotely.

The Town's **Assessor Agent** Rob Duplisea from RJD Appraisal will be available by appointment on **Monday, August 24, 2020**, between 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM to answer any questions you might have about your assessment or tax bill. Please contact the Town Office to schedule an appointment.

New Summer Hours. It's no secret that Saturdays are VERY busy at the Transfer Station. We recognize the inconvenience, frustration, and safety concerns this can cause and want to improve the situation. Residents are encouraged to come to the station during off-peak days and hours (basically not the first thing, and not Saturdays) to help lessen the strain caused by an increased number of residents and visitors using the Transfer Station and necessary Coronavirus precautions. That being said we know that most people can't come to the Transfer Station during the week, so we have decided to offer special summer hours on a trial basis. The Transfer Station will be open Sundays from 8-12 through the end of the summer. Residents are encouraged to come to the Transfer Station once per week to reduce traffic loads, even though we're open an extra day. The Transfer Station staff want to thank you all for your patience and cooperation over the past few months and hope this change makes things safer and easier on everyone!

Governor Mills is mandating that all travelers arriving in Maine or returning to Maine, regardless of where they are from, to self-quarantine for 14 days to help slow the spread of the virus. If you have to self-quarantine, the Selectboard wanted to let you know that the Town has resources available to you. We will do our best to help assist you during your quarantine period. Thank you for protecting your neighbor and yourself.

Please be courteous of your neighbors and drive responsibly. The Town has contracted with Kennebec County Sherriff's Office for rural patrol this summer. Police will take notice.

Several years ago, the Town adopted a **Consumer Fireworks ban**. Please respect this ban for everyone's safety and peaceful enjoyment of town. The Town will enforce this ban.

The Town of Wayne has an Animal Control Ordinance that states no domesticated animal, licensed or unlicensed, shall be permitted on Town property (highways, sidewalks, Ladd Recreation Center, parks, footbridge, Wayne Town House, North Wayne School House, Town Boat Launch, Fire Stations, or old Town Office) without a leash. The Town provides dog waste bags in the parks around the mill pond, please be courteous of others who use these public facilities and pick up after your dogs.

In observation of **Labor Day, Monday, September 7, 2020**, the Town Office will be closed. It will re-open on Tuesday, September 8, 2020, during our regularly scheduled hours.

Your 2020 property taxes were committed in July and tax bills will be mailed at the end of August. **Property taxes are due on Thursday, October 1, 2020.**

Tai Chi continues, and our Widow and Widower support group (both outdoors with distancing). We continue to deliver meals and provide telephone connections. How can we help? We all look forward to the time when life can go back to normal- and in the meantime, please keep in touch with each other.

Phone scams continue during this at home time. From the US Federal Trade Commission: How to Recognize a Phone Scam

The caller might say you were "selected" for an offer or that you've won a lottery. But **if you have to pay to get the prize, it's not a prize.**

Scammers might pretend to be law enforcement or a federal agency. They might say you'll be arrested, fined, or deported if you don't pay taxes or some other debt right away. The goal is to scare you into paying. But **real law enforcement and federal agencies won't call and threaten you.**

Most legitimate businesses will give you time to think their offer over and get written information about it before asking you to commit. Take your time. **Don't get pressured into making a decision on the spot.**

Scammers will often ask you to pay in a way that makes it hard for you to get your money back — by wiring money, putting money on a gift card, prepaid card or cash reload card, or using a money transfer app. **Anyone who asks you to pay that way is a scammer.**

It's never a good idea to give out sensitive information like your Social Security number to someone who calls you unexpectedly, even if they say they're with the Social Security Administration or IRS.


Wilson Pond Paddle




