Library Safety Note: As the winter months approach we are planning to stick with the "short visit" mode for the library. This is to minimize duration of exposure, especially as we start closing windows. Occasional meetings or computer use for longer periods can be arranged to take place on our lower level. We continue to mask inside the building. We are relaxing the book quarantine period to 24-48 hours rather than 72 hours, as guidance from the library world evolves. Thanks to everyone for complying with all this and for the appreciative comments and notes. We are so happy to be able to be open, and look forward to the day when we can have author events, Lego Club and all the other fun things we do!

2020 Library Auction by the Numbers by Lynette Stinneford, Library Auction Chair

Like so many other events this summer, we had to rethink the Library Auction and although we all missed the displays at the Williams' House, our online event was quite successful and provided a lot of entertainment, especially for the coordinators! The online site, 32Auctions, was recommended to Janet by another librarian and we found it easy to implement, access and maintain all of our auction data. In the end, we discovered that the site made it really easy to count things, with no tally marks! We had 163 items donated by 42 donors. 45 items were Buy It Now, including 12 beautiful aprons and 12 stunning (and timely) masks. This year's very popular, limited edition book and characters, Mel and Millie the Meadow Mice were also included in BIN. These unique, handcrafted items were real "hot ticket" items for us. That left 118 items to bid on, far less than previous years but about all that we could manage. We had 72 people register as bidders and they placed a total of 453 bids. We were extremely fortunate to acquire seven Great Wayne Fair Plates and one Wayne Bicentennial Plate from the Chellis family; this is the premier market for these items and we always do well with them whenever we can get them. Five of the top 10 bid-getters were those plates! Three items were close contenders for the impressive highest percentage increase: The 1983 Great Wayne Fair plate with the butterfly went up %500, the courting candle went up %550, and The Pines, done by Christine Dragonetti, went up %600. The bid items netted \$4,972.53 and the BIN added another \$116.00 for a total of \$5,088.53. The website also provided this hilarious statistic: we had 16,559 site visits! Think about that, 73 registered bidders and over 16,000 site visits, that is A LOT of entertainment! We are forever grateful to our always generous donors. This year we truly appreciate our adventurous bidders, who were willing to deal with a whole new system and raise funds for our beloved Cary Memorial Library. We have no idea what next year will bring, but rest assured, there will be an auction in one form or another.

Dear Community, Friends and Supporters,

We want to give you an update on Sustain Wayne's Masonic Hall project.

With Covid-19 and the effect it has had, we thought it was best not to solicit donations during the past several months. As we near the end of the year and look ahead to the future of the Masonic Hall, we are asking for your help. We have a block grant (known as the CDBG Grant) for \$50,000, which will cover exterior work on the building, specifically the roof. The work is slated to begin in May.

Our wish is to raise enough money to replace the foundation, requiring raising the building and also replacing the rotting sill along the General Store side of the building while it is jacked up. The building needs this repair to make it usable. The interior of the building is beautiful but still needs architectural repair to keep the historical footprint. As with any old building, windows, paint, plumbing, and electrical are all needed but will be part of another phase as we raise money. Your support with raising the building would ensure that the old Hall will be around for all of us to enjoy for years to come.

Estimates put the foundation work at around \$90,000. We are hoping to raise this money in the next two to three months so we can get the foundation work done, shoring up the building before any roofing begins.

As we go forward with the project, each phase will be shared with all of you. This building is part of Wayne's history and it is for the whole community. Please consider donating to this very worthy cause. The building cannot withstand sitting idle for much longer without consideration of an alternative plan. Sustain Wayne would like to continue with this project and see it through, but we desperately need your help. Thank you very much. Aging at Home News - November 2020

Welcome to fall! We hope all is well in your household and that no one is sick.

VOTE: If you have not voted, it's almost too

late to do absentee voting, the safest way to cast your ballot. Go to the Town Office (in the school building on Pond Rd) and you can cast your ballot and turn it in while you are there. Or plan to vote in person on Tuesday, November 3. Let us know if you or someone else needs a ride to the polls that day. Whatever you do, PLEASE VOTE!!

GRANT: Aging At Home Wayne was given a grant to help pay for elder's luncheons. Since we are not able to hold these luncheons at present with the Coronavirus lurking, we opted to provide comfort/emergency bags for elders. We did this with permission from the grant agency, Maine Community Foundation. We are stocking tote bags with Covid-useful items (gloves, masks, sanitizer, disinfectant wipes) safety items (flashlights, first-aid kits) and comfort items (fleece throws, mugs, chocolate, and a winter ornament.)

This is not the same as being able to gather and socialize while sharing a meal, but we hope it will begin to make up for missing some of these meals. If you know of someone who could use one of these bags, please call Pam.

GRANT: Another amount of money Aging At Home was granted is from Maine AARP. It has allowed us to purchase 2 picnic tables and 2 benches for the Memorial Park area. One bench will be added to the Farmer's Market part of the park, and a second bench plus 2 picnic tables will be installed across the pond in the Memorial Park. That gives more space for people to buy food and picnic in the area, or just sit and rest between stops in beautiful downtown Wayne. A big Thank You to AARP Maine.

You may be aware that Wayne is partnering with several other towns in the area to enable broadband internet access in the area. If you would like to be up to date on what is happening around broadband, call Aaron at the Town Office.

Utility Scams!! Scammers may call, email and even knock at your door demanding immediate payment for overdue utility bills or they'll shut off your service. When it's storm season and the power goes out, these crooks show up offering to restore service for a payment. The goal is to create a panic in their targets in hopes they will act hastily and pay up. If you get a surprise visit or call from the "utility company," ask questions like what your bill history is or what the individual's employee ID number is, and then confirm before paying.

Airline Ticket Scams!! one of "us" wrote that she had ordered airline tickets for last March from one of the cheap third-party sellers online. She has not, after trying many times, had her money refunded from that. Suggestion: don't buy third party tickets

If you would like services or know of someone else who would like them, please get in touch with me. Our help includes: Phone calls, visits (from a distance), grocery shopping, rides, and meal delivery. If you have other needs, just ask!


