JACOBS SCHOLARSHIP

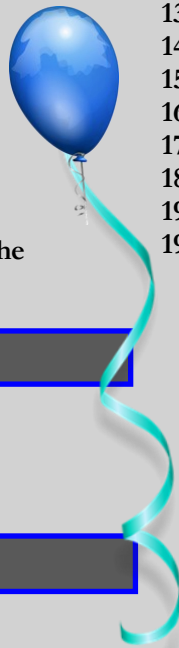

Our Town News

Town Manager—Aaron Chrostowsky

Due to the resurgence of COVID-19 in Maine, the Town Office will continue implementing several new operational changes throughout the month of January 2021.

- The Town Office will be open by appointment only - Residents are requested to avoid conducting business in-person at the Town Office. Please call or email or utilize our many online services. However, if you must conduct business in-person, please contact the Town Office to make an appointment for curbside service.
- The Town Office's new hours of operation will be Monday through Friday from 9 AM to 5 PM. Only one customer will be helped at a time.
- Anyone requesting service must wear a face covering or make alternative arrangements for service. Employees must wear a face-covering in any covering in any office.
- No more than two municipal employees will be allowed in the Town Office at any time.

As you clean out your closets to make room for your new “duds” you got for Christmas. You can now recycle your old clothing, bedding, towels, bags, purses, shoes, and hats by using the drop-off bin which is now located at the Wayne Village Fire Station, 475 Main Street. The Town is participating in a new textile recycling program, Apparel Impact. Apparel Impact is a New Hampshire based company that collects old textiles, properly recycles them, and removes them from the solid waste stream.

In observation of New Years’ Day, Friday, January 1st, 2021, the Town Office and Transfer Station will be closed.

This month the Selectboard will be meeting on January 5 and January 19 at 6:30 PM remotely.

This month the Planning Board will be meeting on January 6 at 6:30 PM remotely.

This month the Conservation Commission will be meeting on January 13 at 6:30 PM remotely.

In observation of Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Monday, January 18, 2021, the Town Office will be closed.

The Town’s Assessor Agent Matt Caldwell from RJD Appraisal will be available by appointment on Monday, January 25, 2021, to answer any questions you might have about your assessment or tax bill. Please contact, the Town Office to schedule an appointment.

Please do not forget to register your dog, you will be assessed a \$25.00 late charge by January 31, 2021. Dog tags are available at the Town Office if you contact the Town Office for details. For busy residents on the go, who cannot make it to the Town Office to register their dog? You may go online to register your dog. Your second installment of property taxes is due by Friday, January 29, 2021. Interest will begin to accrue on February 1, 2021, at 7% per annum.

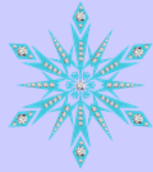
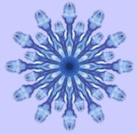
