Dear Neighbors and Friends,

March marks one year since we have been able to worship inside the sanctuary as a community. I remember thinking that we would be back in the building by Easter 2020 and now we know we will not be worshiping in the building for Easter 2021. At first glance, that is something to grieve. But if we stop to take a closer look, we can see that the Church never actually closed. I'd like to share with you some of the wonderful gifts that God has brought out of our time of struggle and confusion.

- In 2019, we usually had anywhere from 2-5 children in Sunday School each week.
 In February, we delivered 30 "Have Faith, Will Travel" take home Sunday School kits to children in Wayne, Livermore, and Turner.
- In 2019, we averaged about 50 people in worship any given Sunday. In 2020, thanks to our livestreamed services, we are averaging 96 people who worship with us at various times throughout the week.
- Since March 2020, we have been able to worship with friends in Connecticut,
 South Carolina, Florida, New Mexico, Oregon, and England!
- Throughout the pandemic, we have strengthened our ties with other area groups.
 Just last month, we teamed up with Aging At Home and delivered Valentine's cards, balloons and cookies to some of our neighbors and friends. We also mailed cards to those living a little further away.
- Thanks to the generosity of our neighbors and friends (especially those who
 responded to our plea in the Messenger), we were able to share half of our
 Christmas Eve offering with Rural Community Action Ministry (RCAM) in Leeds. In
 years past, we have given them \$250 this year, YOU gave them nearly \$900!
- Seasonal residents and neighbors have been able to join us for worship and be a part of committees all year round. We all benefit from their generous gifts, ideas, and time.
- Some friends have donated all or portions of their stimulus checks to our Pastor's Discretionary Fund so that we can help folks with rent, heat, medical bills and other pressing needs.

Now, as we go through Lent together and prepare for another Easter outside the walls of the sanctuary, I am reminded that Jesus did all his best work outside. He taught on mountainsides and from boats. He walked dusty streets surrounded by crowds, meeting people wherever they were in the moment (physically, emotionally and spiritually). We look forward to meeting you outside, too! Whether that is for our Easter Sunrise Service or while out for a walk or on Facebook live for worship. The Church has NOT closed and we can't wait to connect with YOU!

Wayne Church Hannaford Card Fundraising

The Wayne Community Church has an ongoing fundraiser with Hannaford. By placing a bulk order for gift cards, the Church earns 5% of the sales. So for example, purchasing a \$100 card, or reloading an existing card through the program earns \$5 for the Church, and gives the Purchaser a \$100 value card to use at Hannaford. If you spend \$100 each week at Hannaford, this would earn \$260 for the Church in one year without any additional cost to you! The cards can be used for anything except purchasing another gift card, lottery tickets, or getting cash back. It can be used for "Hannaford To Go".

All you need to do is email Hazel Stevenson at wcchannafordgc@yahoo.com and mail or drop a check at the Church office (PO Box 300, Wayne, ME 04284). Once you have a card from the program, you can continue to reload the same card the same way. You decide how much and how often you want to add to your card. A weekly bank deduction is also an option.

Did You Know?

"It was a warm summer night in the early 1950s when a young woman by the name of Joan Ward, of Winthrop, first met George Morse of Dixfield. He teased her unmercifully until she finally agreed to one dance. Even though there was just one dance that night, she went home and told her mother she had met her future husband. They were married just a couple of years later when he returned from Korea, where he served as a Marine. This young couple would be my parents, and I so loved to hear the story of how they met. I only wish the Moon -Glo were still in existence; what a great venue for dancing, for fellowship and romance."

"Musicians were Foster Beach on Trombone, Horace Davenport on Drums, Vivian Lincoln on Piano, and Waldo Lincoln on Violin. My parents, Paul and Charlene Gould, were present at The Moon-Glo with Charlene's parents, Ervin and Flossie Burleigh, on November 20, 1951, during the unusual winter of 1951-1952. The stars were out that night, but the next morning they saw 5 feet of snow on the ground!"

The Moon-Glo Pavilion could be found tucked into the woods off Rt. 133 across from the present day public boat ramp. It was originally built to entertain the guests of the Androscoggin House, but soon became popular with Wayne and surrounding communities. Sadly, some thirty years later after the hotel closed the building was torn down.

Did you know in the early 1930's the *Kennebec Journal* wasn't the only paper available? Due to the resurgence of COVID-19 in Maine, the Town Office will continue implementing several new operational changes throughout the month of March 2021.

- · Residents are encouraged to avoid conducting business in-person at the Town Office. Please call or email or utilize our many online services at www.waynemaine.org.
- However, if you must conduct business in-person, please contact the Town Office ahead to schedule curbside service.
- The Town Office's new temporary hours of operation will be Monday through Friday from 9 AM to 5 PM. Only one customer will be helped at a time.
- · Anyone requesting service must wear a face covering or make alternative arrangement for service. Employees must wear a face covering in the office.

Winter is here! Winter sand is available for residents' use only. This sand can be picked up at the Fairbank Road site. Please be considerate of your neighbors and only take two (2) five (5) gallon buckets per storm.

Please take notice, Maine State Law: 29-A, M.R.S.A. §2396, prohibits any person from placing in the public way snow or slush that has not accumulated there naturally.

The Town of Wayne has posted all Town roads for the mud season. All overweight trucks will need to get permits at the Town Office to travel Posted Roads. During the spring thaw, please use caution while driving on Town roads, water can be on the road, new potholes can form and thick mud can be present. If you have any road issues, please don't hesitate to contact the Town Office at (207) 685-4983 or towmanager@waynemaine.org.

All nomination papers are due to the Town Clerk on Monday, April 9, 2021.

A Joint District Selectboards and RSU Board of Directors will be meeting on March 10 at 6:30 PM at the Maranacook Middle School to discuss the school budget.

The Town's Assessor Agent Matt Caldwell from RJD Appraisal will be available by appointment on Monday, March 22 2021 to answer any questions you might have about your assessment or tax bill. Please contact, the Town Office to schedule an appointment.

Your third and final installments of property taxes are due by Thursday, April 1st, 2021 at 5:00 PM. Interest will begin to accrue on April 2nd, 2021 at 7% per annum.

NOTICE of TAX ACQUIRED PROPERTY SALE

The Selectboard of the Town of Wayne, Maine, accepts bids for the purchase of the municipality's interest in one (1) tax-acquired property. Each bid must be in writing and in a sealed envelope marked "Tax-Acquired Property Bid" outside the envelope. Each bid shall be for one property only. Any person wishing to bid on several properties must submit a separate bid for each one. Each bid must also include the bidder's name, mailing address, and phone number and must be accompanied by a Bank Treasurer's Check made payable to "Town of Wayne, Maine" in the amount of at least the listed minimum bid price as a deposit for the bid. Each successful bidder's deposit will be credited to the total purchase price for that parcel. Deposit checks will be returned to the unsuccessful bidders. Any bid that does not contain the proper deposit will be rejected. Submit bids to Selectboard, Town of Wayne, P.O. Box

400, 48 Pond Road, Wayne, ME 04284.

The Selectboard must receive all bids no later than 5:00 PM on Tuesday, March 23, 2021, at the Wayne Town Office. Late, faxed, or emailed bids will not be opened or considered. Bids will be opened, read aloud at 5:00 PM on Monday, March 23, 2021, at the Wayne Town Office. The Selectboard will review and either award or reject all bids at 6:30 PM on Tuesday, March 30, 2021, at their Selectboard's Meeting located at Wayne Town Office. The Selectboard retains the right to accept or reject any and all bids as they determine to be in the best interest of the Town. Each successful bidder shall have 30 days from the date of bid acceptance to complete the purchase at the discretion of the Selectboard. The property will be conveyed by a quitclaim deed without covenants. The person issued a quitclaim deed is solely responsible for evicting tenants and or former owners from the property. In the event that a successful bidder fails, for any reason, to complete the purchase in the time stated, the bid acceptance is void, and the bidder's deposit shall be forfeited to the Town. The Selectboard may thereafter negotiate a sale of the property with any or all-unsuccessful bidders.


