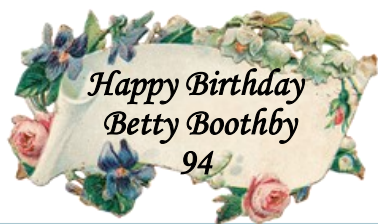

Announcing the 2021 FOL Raffle Quilt: 16 Patch

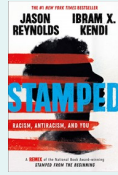

Invasive Milfoil in Androscoggin Lake Community Meeting: June 17th, 6:30 PM

The **Wayne Conservation Commission** hosted a bird walk at 7:00 AM on May 13, 2021, on Wayne's 100 Acre Wood. Howard Lake and Jane Andrews led the group of 13 down the House Road hoping to make use of the open road to make visibility easier. (And tick-free!) The weather was sunny with mild breezes, the trees were budding out and filled with bird song.

At the outset we saw a Great Crested Flycatcher perched on a high branch, making sure we all had time to admire his yellow belly. We were then rewarded with the sighting of a Broad Winged Hawk nest nestled in the crook of a small oak branch. With our leaders' help, our avian show included: Least Flycatcher, Blue Headed Vireo, Black Throated Green Warbler, Black Throated Blue Warbler, Broad Winged Hawk, Yellow Bellied Sapsucker, 3 flying Loons and 4 flying Turkey Vultures. And, of course, Crow, Blue Jay, and Chickadee.

We heard the following birds: Black and White Warbler, Pine Warbler, Northern Cardinal, American Goldfinch and Canada Goose.

As we neared the end of our walk, an Oven Bird appeared on a branch, sitting still while Howard made sure we all were successful in spotting him. Our knowledgeable leaders shared tidbits about the birds we encountered and gave us resource information should we wish to learn more. We are very grateful to our two leaders and hope we can do this again.

April 24, 2021, the **Wayne Conservation Commission** hosted a walk in Wayne's 100-Acre Wood. Led by Leslie Burhoe, the 10 participants traveled the orange flagged trail on the northern part of the property. We traveled around the trail to a newly flagged branch of the trail that led towards the House Road and the cellar hole of the original House Homestead. From there the group headed south along the western boundary following the orange trail as it curved east approaching the southern boundary of the higher ground. This is a lovely path following a stone wall through open woods. Heading east we took another new branch off the original orange flagged trail that approaches the top of the steep slopes. During this time of no leaves, we were allowed a view of Mt. Pisgah and Wilson Pond. Then this new trail heads north through a grove of large hemlocks heavy with ferns in the understory. We reached the original orange flagged trail and headed back north towards the parking lot.

This beautiful 118 Acre woodland bordering Wilson Pond is being conserved for the benefit of the Wayne community, but help is needed to make it accessible so that more people can enjoy it.

Several groups have already enjoyed participating in the property walks and birdwatching outings sponsored by the Conservation Commission. We hope to have more educational offerings in the future.

Thanks to very generous early donors a parking lot has been installed at the end of House Road.

The surveying is completed, and ***the need to raise funds is urgent as the payment for the survey is due.*** After this, the next steps are trail development and installation of benches and an information kiosk.
