

AAH News, July 2021



New COVID prevention guidance from Maine's CDC allows fully vaccinated Americans not to wear face coverings indoors, effective May 24.

Maine has lifted the physical distancing requirement for indoor public settings. It recommends that people in Maine who are not fully vaccinated wear face coverings in indoor public settings. The U.S. CDC requires people to wear masks on all planes, buses, trains, and other forms of public transportation.

"For people who are not vaccinated, including children too young to receive a COVID-19 vaccine, wearing a mask remains one of the most effective ways of protecting yourself and your family against this highly contagious disease," said Jeanne Lambrew, Commissioner of the Maine Department of Health and **Human Services.**

Please get vaccinated if you have not. Protect yourselves and your family and friends by doing this. WEAR A MASK if you have not been vaccinated.

Monmouth — On June 14, 2021, Monmouth residents Charlie Jacobs and Rebecca Stanley donated a 273-acre conservation easement to the Kennebec Land Trust (KLT) that features 123 acres of woodlands, 79 acres of wetlands, 58 acres of open fields, and over 3,670 feet of undeveloped shorefront on Annabessacook Lake, and protects forever a well-known scenic vista from the Macomber Road.

The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (MDIFW) has mapped portions of the property as containing high-to-moderate value waterfowl and wading bird habitat. Several of the fields include valuable agricultural soils and are currently a source of hay for Maine dairy and beef operations. The Town of Monmouth's Comprehensive plan notes the agricultural and scenic values of the property and in particular the sweeping views of Mount Pisgah and the western mountains.

Conservation easements are legal documents that limit the type and scope of development on a property. These lands are still privately owned but are protected forever by a conservation entity. With this generous and farsighted gift, KLT now holds easements on 2,360 acres in the Kennebec River and Lakes region. In addition, KLT owns over 4,600 acres with fifty-four miles of trails that are open to the public for outdoor recreation, including hiking, hunting, fishing, paddling, skiing, and nature observation.

At the time of their donation, Charlie and Rebecca noted, "This land that we love has a wonderful diversity of wildlife habitats, productive farmland, and scenic views. It is also very important to us to help protect the water quality of Annabessacook Lake by preventing the development of waterfront property. We are thrilled to be able to ensure that this land will not be developed and that the traditional views along Macomber Road of open fields and forestland will be preserved. Many thanks to KLT for giving us the opportunity to maintain this land as open space for the future."

In recognizing the significance of this gift, Kim Vandermeulen, President of the KLT's Board of Directors, said, "Currently Maine is experiencing increasing development pressure and the associated conversion of forestland and farmland to other uses. These losses generate carbon emissions and are contributing to the earth's rising temperatures. Since undeveloped land sequesters and stores carbon, land conservation projects like the Jacobs-Stanley easement not only protect valuable woods, wetlands, shoreland, and agricultural soils, they are also part of a natural solution to climate change. Charlie and Rebecca's gift is truly a legacy for current and future generations.

Since 1988, KLT has worked cooperatively with landowners and communities to conserve the forests, shorelands, fields, and wildlife that define central Maine. The Trust's conserved lands encompass over 7,200 acres in the Kennebec River and Lakes region.
