Dear Friends & Neighbors,

The warmest of fall greetings to you! As I write to you from my office at the church, I am sitting next to a colorful print by Nerina Canzi, an Argentinian illustrator. The print is called, "El Hijo Pródigo" or "The Prodigal Son." The two men in the illustration are wrapped up in each others arms, eyes closed, and eyebrows raised in relief and joy as though tears are about to flow. The painter's palette includes bright blues, greens, reds, rich creams, and warm browns. They are the same colors that fill nature's palette this season: reds, greens and browns in the leaves; deep blues in the sky and the water; pink and cream colors in the dried hydrangea that have moved from the bush in front of the parsonage to a vase in the parsonage living room. The only thing I am missing... the hug!

There is no sense of bravado in the print, no puffing up of chests or shrinking away in fear or intimidation. There is no cause for concern or questioning of motives. Simply two people who missed each other, who love each other, embracing one another and the moment. It is an image of harmony. When you go back to the story in the Bible, you quickly see that the harmony wasn't there from the beginning and it didn't last long when the older brother catches wind of what's going on, but right there, in the moment, you can feel it emanating from the illustration.

Right now, it feels like there are too many obstacles to harmony and it can be overwhelming. There are obstacles to harmony in nature, obstacles to harmony in families, obstacles to harmony between nations. These obstacles come with many different names: climate crisis, white supremacy, religious extremism, nationalism, nuclear weapon escalation, political polarity. You name it, we can argue about it. We can be like the older brother and point out all the wrongs the younger brother committed. We can be angry at the father for just letting his younger son come back into his life even after all the disrespect and waste. We can get all hung up in our constant questioning and criticizing and finger-pointing. We can even ignore it all and curl up in our own private bubbles pretending that none of it involves us, thereby negating our responsibility for any of it. We can blame God or those "other" folk "over there" and just give up on all of it. But none of those responses will bring us what we are all actually deeply hungering: Harmony. Peace. The stuff of paintings and colorful illustrations – of fall afternoons with clear skies and fresh air – of freshly baked apple pie and warm butternut squash soup. If we want that, we need to overcome some obstacles... together.

So, we continue learning how our collective choices come to impact the environment and we seek ways to take action (maybe check out [www.thirdact.com](http://www.thirdact.com)). We continue learning about racial inequities in our systems of government, education, healthcare, and churches (you might consider joining me in reading and discussing "White Too Long" by Robert P. Jones). We continue learning about the plight of asylum seekers and refugees (United Methodists in New England are working with the International Institute of New England to begin assisting Afghan refugees who will be settling in Lowell, MA). There are all kinds of ways to get involved, but more importantly, there are all kinds of ways to keep ourselves open to the promise of Harmony – to overcoming our obstacles and embracing one another. All kinds of ways to say – "I miss you. I love you."

Aging At Home will be without our coordinator Pam for about 4 months starting mid-October while she has back surgeries in Boston and recuperates. We are raising funds to replace her during this period. If you would like to fill all or part of Pam's AAH responsibilities (for pay) while she is out, please get in touch with us. 1. "Shoo Fly, Don't Bother Me" was first published in 1869 by White, Smith & Perry. It is not entirely clear who wrote it, but this person, born in Wayne is often given credit.
2. This person, born in Wayne served in the Union Army during the American Civil War and the Freedmens Bureau in Georgia during the Reconstruction Era. He also worked as a newspaper editor, Republican Party organizer, member of the Georgia House of Representatives and a candidate for U.S. Congress.
3. This person was born in Wayne, Maine. After their natural gifts as a singer becoming evident, they went to Italy and studied in Milan with Giovanni Corsi. That year, they made their debut in Italian opera.
4. This person born in Wayne, Maine was a Wisconsin politician, lumber merchant and manufacturer, and influential businessman in Wisconsin.
5. Although not born in Wayne, this person was a longtime summer resident and creator of the first automatic machine gun.

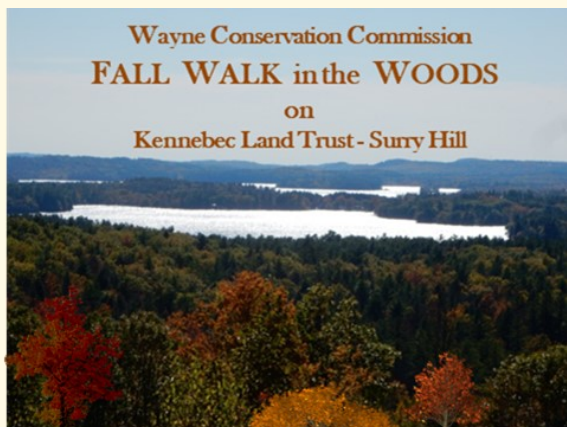
