The Wayne Community Church has an ongoing fundraiser with Hannaford. By placing a bulk order for gift cards, the Church earns 5% of the sales. 

#### An overview of soil materials in Wayne and their general suitability for septic systems

I've been asked to give a general description of common soil materials in Wayne, and their relative suitability for locating domestic septic systems. Here I'm using "soil" in reference to the sediments laid down on top of bedrock by the action of glaciers, water, and wind. This is the realm of "surficial geology" which looks deeper into the ground than the surface soil maps of Kennebec County by federal soil surveys (former U. S. Dept. of Agriculture).

Wetlands and river flood plains are not suitable for waste disposal, so that leaves four other types of common soil material in this part of the state:

*Glacial till* dating back to the Ice Age. Till is a random mixture of rock and mineral particles – everything from clay and silt particles to large boulders. It was scoured from the landscape by slowly flowing glaciers, often ground down to smaller pieces, and left behind when the ice melted. Common varieties include (1) very compact silty-sandy till plastered down and shaped into smooth hillslopes and ridges beneath the heavy glacier (hard to excavate!) and (2) looser, sandier till – often with boulders – that melted out from higher up in the ice.

Sand and gravel are laid down mostly by streams of water coming from the melting glacier, but also include small areas of beach gravel from a period of marine submergence (see below). A prominent ridge of glacial sand and gravel occurs along Fairbanks and Mt. Pisgah roads in Wayne.

*Dune sand* blown by strong winds from the Androscoggin River valley and left as dunes and thin irregular sand patches blanketing hills east of the river. The "desert of Wayne" is one of the best known examples. Windblown sand is distinguished by its fine, even texture, absence of rocks, and ease of excavation.

*Marine clay* settled to the ocean floor just after the glacier melted away from this area when low-lying areas of southern Maine were briefly flooded by the ocean (up to elevations of about 350 feet in Wayne). The clay is found around Wayne village and in other low ground in various places. It tends to be sticky when wet but very hard when dry.

Water easily sinks into and flows through the sands and gravels, especially the dune sands. The high permeability of these soils is not good for absorption fields in septic systems, since it reduces any natural purification of liquid waste that otherwise may occur and may also result in contamination of sand and gravel aquifers.

On the other hand, the low permeability of clay and dense fine-grained till causes effluent to pond up on the ground surface.

That leaves sandy till which has moderate permeability and in many places is one of the best soil materials in which to place a septic absorption field. This type of till can be hard to locate without a test pit, but it tends to underlie lower slopes and areas of uneven topography. It also formed low stony ridges (moraines) along the retreating glacier margin, such as the ones crossed by Lord Road.

Other factors come into play, notably the depth to bedrock, depth to water table, steepness of slope, and natural drainage conditions. All these properties can vary abruptly over very short distances, so it is important to have a State-licensed soil scientist (site evaluator) examine a prospective septic system site and determine whether it satisfies all applicable regulations. Professionals in this field can often find solutions to make less-than-ideal sites pass muster.

In rural areas, domestic sewage is commonly released into the ground via a combination of septic tank and absorption field, as shown in the figure below. The earth material in the absorption field acts upon the sewage and reduces groundwater contamination in several ways:


Filtration

Sorption, including absorption of chemicals into mineral particles and adsorption onto particle surfaces

Ion exchange (exchange of ions between sewage and mineral particles)

#### Dilution and dispersion

Oxidation and biochemical processes in the zone of aeration (the zone above the water table)




