Dear Friends and Neighbors,

August 2022

Psalm 9:1 - I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart; I will tell of all your wonderful deeds.

One thing that has again been made clear to me over the last month is the generosity and kindness of folks who live in Wayne. Whether they are here for two weeks, 4 months, or all year-round, this community cares for one another. I have also been reminded of the generosity and kindness of strangers. In July, my mother and I were in Germany and Austria for two weeks with a group of United Methodists from New England, including our Bishop Suda. The journey began with a 3- hour delay in Boston which caused us to miss our flight to Munich. Blessing in the hassle? We had a beautiful afternoon spent walking the neighborhood around our Amsterdam hotel, visited a working windmill and got to know one another, some for the first time! Unfortunately, the airline ran out of vouchers, so only some of us received a breakfast box to-go. Blessing in the hassle? We experienced a true "loaves and fishes" moment as in our sharing, everyone was fed!

Up next, of the 15 of us who traveled together, 5 of us never did receive our luggage (1 has been delivered upon returning home). We were a few of over 100,000 folks whose luggage never made it out of Amsterdam. Blessing in the hassle? We were touring with another group of Methodists from Louisiana and between us, we were able to clothe as well as provide chargers and other necessities for each other. We, quite literally, were given the shirts off people's backs.

In the Alpine town of Achensee, in the pouring down rain, we took a covered boat ride around the lake and enjoyed coffee and strudel together. Many of us visited a shop that sells unique beauty products. My mom and I were looking at shampoos and face creams to replace what we had lost. Blessing in the hassle? When the salesperson heard about our missing luggage, she pulled out sample upon sample. So many that we were able to share with the other two women who had lost their luggage and even had some upon returning home. We called this our "Balm of Gilead" moment as the essential oils used in their products are known for their healing qualities (steinöl or "stone oil").

We hadn't been in Austria long when I learned that an email hoax had gone out to just about everyone on the church email list asking for a moment of folk's time and then requesting gift cards coming from what looked like both my personal and professional email accounts (the addresses were actually a little different from mine). For those who knew I was ACTUALLY traveling and experiencing some difficulties, it was concerning to say the least. But we all quickly addressed the hoax and got the word out that I was fine and that I will never (NEVER) ask for help in this manner. Blessing in the hassle? The love and care that poured out from folks (some of whom I haven't even met in person yet) was beautiful and appreciated. Each one of you, a good Samaritan.

None of that stopped us from soaking in the beauty of the Tyrol and Bavarian regions and their people. My mom and I had a couple of extra days on our own and we traveled just half an hour by train over the border just so we could say we had lunch in Italy (and ate REAL Italian pizza)! We had deep moments of inspiration at the Oberammergau Passionspiele (Passion Play), visited 14<sup>th</sup>-century churches, and began and ended each day in prayer with our group. I am convinced that, because we did not let the hassles ruin our journey, we were able to see the abundant blessings God was pouring out upon us every day. Even when half of our group returned home with COVID, we all continued to stay in touch, to check in with each other, to pray for one another. More blessings and gratitude that COVID was mostly just a hassle for all of us – thank God for inspiring scientists to develop vaccines.

And so, I do give God thanks. I will tell everyone of God's wonderful works. But most of all, I give God thanks for each and every one of you.



We are so excited to announce our new "bridge" with Aging at Home. It is a joy to provide Pam with an office and to share space with our community elders! Welcome home!

The Wayne Community Church Re-Entry Task Force have recommended the following changes to our current COVID procedures, effective July 18, 2022:

Masks are welcomed, but optional in all areas of the church facilities.

Distancing signs will be removed from the pews.

Worship will continue to be held both in-person and via Facebook Live.

First, we want to thank everyone for being so attentive and gracious about caring for one another during these uncertain times. We know that some thought our precautions were too tight or that they lasted too long, but our primary concern was protecting our most vulnerable even if the majority of our community would not experience severe symptoms from COVID. As we know, Jesus's primary concern was certainly for the vulnerable.

The new variants of COVID are highly contagious and masks also protect us from other community borne illnesses (like colds, flu, viral pneumonia, etc). We continue to follow CDC guidelines, so if you have come in direct contact with someone who has tested positive, please avoid the church building for 5 days. If you aren't feeling well, please avoid the church building and let the pastor know so we can be in prayer for you or provide whatever assistance you might need. We trust that a faith community like ours will be one of support and encouragement regardless of a person's choice to wear a mask or not. 1 Thessalonians 5: 11, "Therefore encourage one another and build up each other...."

We are deeply grateful for the work of the Trustees and Finance committees who have worked together to make it possible for new heat pumps to be installed in the sanctuary. These heat pumps will benefit our community in three ways: climate care (reducing our use of fossil fuels), energy cost savings, as well as health and wellness. The four heat pumps will filter the air that goes through them and they all include a UV strip that works to sanitize air particles. We hope this additional measure will also work to reduce the risk of spreading illness.

Outside Groups will continue to use their own discretion regarding masks, communal eating, etc. Again, thank you for your love and care these last few years. Our Re-Entry Task Force will continue to monitor

any changes in recommended COVID protocols from reliable, scientifically sound sources and will update as necessary.

And, heads up, library hours will shift back to Fall mode once we get to the week of Aug. 22-- stay tuned.



- Improved muscle strength and definition.


Many of our practitioners find the improved balance to be their best health benefit. Come watch or try it yourself. Fridays at 11AM.
