Thanks to a generous gift from Tom and Jan Cook, one of our dreams at Wayne Community Church is becoming a reality! We want to share our excitement with you about a new "Bridge" project that will help us provide healing and hope to the whole community. We are improving our audio/visual capacity at the church and working with experts who are simultaneously working to maintain the beauty and historical character of the Sanctuary we all know and love. By improving our livestreaming capabilities, providing a space at the back of the sanctuary for the equipment, and adding an electrically retractable screen, we envision this project as benefitting the entire community. Our livestreamed worship services have been enjoyed in 20 towns in Maine, 14 states across the nation (plus D.C.) and 3 other countries but we have not had a way to share videos well in the sanctuary. We look forward to not only improved worship experience, but also celebrating weddings and funerals with the ability to share videos that everyone can see and hear. We will be able to welcome local groups and guest speakers who will be able to bring their presentations and include a larger audience who can watch from home. Friendly, reminder the Town Office hours of operation are Tuesday through Friday from 9 AM to 5 PM.

Winter is here! **Winter sand** is available for residents' use only (not for commercial purposes) on Fairbank Road near the Town Sand/ Salt Shed, only two buckets per storm.

Reminder, the filing deadline is December 1, 2022, for Property Tax Stabilization Program, which is a state program that allows certain senior-citizen residents to stabilize, or freeze, the property taxes on their homestead. As long as you qualify and file a timely application each year, the tax billed to you for your homestead will be frozen at the amount you were billed in the prior tax year. Eligible residents who move may transfer the fixed tax amount to a new homestead, even if that new homestead is in a different Maine municipality. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact the Town Office. If you filed an application, you will receive a decision letter in January 2023.

#### **NOTES AND EXPLANATIONS**

### Minimum Fees and Why We Charge for Some Items:

There is a minimum \$3 fee for any and all demolition debris, bulky waste, and other special waste. The fees associated with these items marginally cover the cost of disposal and are in place to ensure personal accountability for special waste disposal and that these items are not paid for by other taxpayers.

#### Fee Schedule Establishment and Changes:

The current Fee Schedule is effective 1/1/2023. All fees and conditions are subject to changes adopted by the Readfield Select Board upon recommendation of the Solid Waste and Recycling Committee, in accordance with Ordinances and Interlocal Agreements adopted by voters.

#### Payment Methods (Cash or):

Electronic Payment - The Transfer Station accepts electronic payments but transaction fees are paid by the cardholder.

Checks - The Transfer Station accepts checks for less than \$250 at the discretion of the Transfer Station staff.

Receipts - A receipt will be issued for all fees collected.

### Transfer Station Conduct:

See an Attendant before dropping any waste or if you have any questions about how or where to dispose of items. Everyone at the Transfer Station must be respectful to staff and other users and follow all rules of the facility. Inappropriate behavior may result in temporary or permanent restriction of access. Transfer Station staff will make decisions to accept or reject materials, to assess disposal charges, and to verify payment of appropriate fees. Disagreements over these matters may be brought to the Transfer Station Manager or Town Manager.

### Wayne's 100-Acre Wood December 2022 Update

Much progress has been made toward conservation goals for our Town's largest and most beautiful open space parcel over the last 18 months.

- A professional boundary survey was completed in late spring 2021. This work was needed to resolve discrepancies
  between the deeded record and actual property boundary lines, some of which could not be located before the
  survey.
- The Wayne Conservation Commission (WCC) has worked with abutting land owners to identify their respective property lines and ensure good neighbor relations such as avoiding encroachments. Two conservation-minded abutters offered to make boundary adjustments with the Town which would add several acres and enhance the conservation and recreation value of the 100-Acre Wood.
- There is now a 1-mile loop trail along the upper slope originating from the parking area. It is not a difficult walk, and is marked for easy identification. Plans for additional trails are in progress.

There is more work to be done. The Town has signed a contract with Main-Land Development Consultants to write legal descriptions for the boundary agreement and land exchange and to install new boundary corners and lines, in follow-up to the original survey. The cost for this work is expected to be approximately \$2,600. There will be other expenditures too. The Town needs to place boulders along the property line with one abutter, and there will be attorney fees associated with the legal work. We also hope to install a permanent information kiosk at the parking area in spring 2023

When Wayne residents voted in 2019 to conserve this land as open space for public use and low impact outdoor recreation, there was no money in the budget for the boundary survey, legal costs, trail construction, and related amenities. The Conservation Commission has agreed to raise private donations to cover these costs.

The Town maintains a designated fund to accept donations. If you have already donated to this fund (as have all WCC members), thank you! We still need your help.

Why does this matter? We need beautiful natural areas more than ever, and we are fortunate to have this local gem of mixed woods, wildlife habitat, dramatic terrain, and shoreline on Wilson Pond. The 100-Acre Wood enhances the quality of life in our town.

Here is what you need to present at the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to obtain the Real ID:

Identity (Name and birth date) AND

Lawful status in the US AND

Valid Social Security number AND

Maine residency documents.

Deadline for the Property Tax Stabilization Program, a state program which "freezes" property taxes for certain senior citizens, is December 1, 2022, for this coming year. You must have your application to the Wayne Town Office before then. But you must apply for each year. You can qualify even if you move from one town to another in Maine. The property must be your "primary residence or homestead."




