Dear friends and neighbors,

Two years ago, Wayne Community Church celebrated the bicentennial of our sanctuary. Built in 1820, we received our first Methodist preacher in 1821 (Aaron Fuller). Since then, we have been served by part-time and full-time pastors, some of whom we shared with other United Methodist congregations, or who came to us from other denominations with the approval of the United Methodist church. Our clergy are all appointed by the Bishop and her cabinet which is made up of District Superintendents. Wayne is located within the Many Waters District which covers 67 churches in a huge swath of Maine extending from our southwestern point in Eliot and York, northwest to Fryeburg and Kingfield, and east all the way to Unity and back down the coast through Brunswick and Kennebunk. Churches and pastors create profiles and update them regularly to help the Bishop's Cabinet make appointments that are Holy Spirit led and match the gifts of church and pastor. In 2019, the Holy Spirit brought me to Wayne in what I believe, and I hope you agree, was a good fit. Together, we have made it through a pandemic together, revitalized our bridges with other community groups and neighbors, and built on a foundation that was laid back in 1794 in the homes of friends and neighbors who then pooled their resources to build a Methodist Church 25 years later. This year, effective July 1, you will have the opportunity to welcome a new pastor who brings gifts from another part of our global United Methodist Church. It is my privilege to present to you, the wider community of Wayne, the incoming pastor at the Wayne Community Church, UMC: Rev. Marcos Juliao.

The Reverend Marcos Antonio Juliao is an Elder from the United Methodist Church in Brazil. He is currently serving the United Methodist Church in Weymouth, Massachusetts – The New Family Church. He has completed his master's degree at Boston University and is now working on a doctorate. Pastor Marcos' ministry has been very diverse, having served in different settings and regions in Brazil from seminarian to District Superintendent in Sao Paulo and Amazonas/Roraima. Pastor Marcos has also had the opportunity to minister the Gospel in several different countries on four different continents.



A pastor, writer, and missionary, Reverend Marcos is a husband and father. He loves to see the church as a body of Christ and has been dedicating his life to equip and care for people whose desire includes being a Disciple of Jesus Christ.

My prayer for all of you is that you will allow the Spirit to lead you in new and exciting ways. May you welcome Rev. Marcos and his wife, Pastor Mauren, with open arms and open homes, as you did for me. I know they will love and lead you with hearts of deep compassion and gifts to take you into the beautiful future God has envisioned for you! I have truly been blessed to serve you.


# Cary Memorial Library and the Wayne Community Church offer: Community Conversations on Gender Identity

Do you ever wonder about the meaning of the letters LGBTQIA? Do you feel confused when you hear a woman or man referred to as "they or them" rather than "she or he?"

Over the past two summers you may have participated in, or heard about, our Community Conversations on Race and Immigration. These programs were supported by grants from the United Methodist Foundation of New England, as well as the budgets of the Wayne Community Church and the Cary Memorial Library. Our discussions and speakers were met with great enthusiasm by many Wayne residents and summer visitors, and a topic that was suggested for this summer was Gender Identity.

Gay and Transgender are words we see daily in the media. To help us become more informed and comfortable with the terminology and with the reality of our social context, the Library and the Church are collaborating and planning "Community Conversations on Gender Identity" for this summer.

We will read and discuss the book **Becoming Nicole**, by Amy Ellis Nutt, the very informative and interesting non-fiction account of a Maine family struggling with, and embracing, a transgender child. **The book discussion will take place on July 19 at 7:00 pm outside under a tent at the library, if the weather is fine.** (If weather dictates, we can move to church.) We plan to conduct the discussion in person but will offer a Zoom opportunity if there is sufficient need. Though we are no longer eligible for a grant to purchase and provide books to participants, the Library will have multiple copies of the book for borrowing. The Town has an Animal Control Ordinance that states no domesticated animal, licensed or unlicensed, shall be permitted on Town property (highways, sidewalks, Ladd Recreation Center, parks, footbridge, Wayne Town House, North Wayne School House, Town Boat Launch, Fire Stations, or old Town Office) **without a leash**. The Town provides dog waste bags in the parks around the millpond, please be courteous to others who use these public facilities, and please **pick up after your dogs**.

The new Friends of the Library Raffle Quilt, Kathy's Roses, will be unveiled at the FOL Spring Plant & Bake Sale on Sat. May 27 at the Williams House. Each quilt has a story, and for this one, we thank Connie Hulse for sharing the background, and showing all the skill and thought that goes into a handmade quilt:

The name of this year's quilt is "Kathy's Roses."

This quilt was made in honor of our dear friend Kathy Leclair. Our Kathy was amongst other things, a prolific gardener and quilter. She loved flowers in her gardens and in her quilts. Sadly, she passed away after a long and bravely fought battle with cancer.

From Kathy's fabric stash came the following fabrics - the light blue with roses used in the sashing, the light yellow with roses used in the cornerstones, the dusty rose with the small flowers used in the setting triangles and borders, and the dusty rose with the fussy cut large roses used in the border.

Donated well before this quilt was thought of, the three other fabrics in this quilt came from other quilters - the dusty rose and green used in the heart blocks, binding and 4-patches in the borders, and the soft yellow with small flowers used in the background of the borders. These fabrics tied all the others together as if it had been planned.

Each of the pieces of fabric were used up in its entirety. Seems that the fabrics knew they were destined to become this very special quilt. This quilt measures 96" by 96".



#### **Phyllis Marie Woodsum**

#### 1928-2023

Surrounded by family Phyllis Marie Woodsum, 94, died on May 12, 2023. Phyllis, born September 17, 1928, was raised in Medford with her three siblings by a single mother (Helen Tolman) during the Depression in Massachusetts. She was fun loving and gregarious from the start with lots of friends and was an artist from a young age.

When she was 15, she joined the Civil Air Patrol by creating the first female squadron and earned many leadership citations, learning to fly at Bolton Airport in MA. In February 1949 she married George A. Woodsum, a pilot and Captain in the Army Air Corps, at Tufts University Chapel, nearby to Jumbo the Elephant. They began their life of adventures with a 6-month honeymoon in Paris. Returning home, they settled into Sterns Village at Tufts University for several years where George studied while Phyllis began raising their family of four children and upon moving to Tyngsboro, MA founded a nursery school. Phyllis and George built their dream house in Ridgefield, CT and were founding members of the Ridgefield First Church of Christ Scientist. Their new community of church builders became their closest lifelong friends. During this time Phyllis studied art with Master Watercolorist Frank Soltesz.

The next adventure was to move back to their ancestral home of Maine settling at MainStay Farm in Wayne. Phyllis taught art classes locally and some of her own paintings were displayed at the Maine State House. At 50 years old Mom went to college at Danbury State College in Connecticut earning her bachelors and master's degrees in Secondary Education. This led to a 25-year career teaching at Lewiston High School where she was affectionately known as Meme.

In her later years Mom spent a lot of time reminiscing about the special places in her life: Cundy's Harbor visiting her Aunt Winnie and Uncle Ralph during summers; Green Pond where 4 generations of Woodsums and close friends gathered for summers; Ridgefield, CT while her children were teenagers; and her 54 years at MainStay Farm where she daily enjoyed the beauty of nature.

Phyllis was predeceased by her bother Linwood (Lonnie) in childhood, mother Helen, husband George in 1993, brother Bill Tolman, and brother-in-law Harvey Robinson. # SAVE ANDROSCOGGIN UPDATE: DEP APPROVES WATERSHED PROTECTION PLAN!

A major part of the Save Androscoggin – Campaign for a Healthy Lake program was completion in 2022 of the Androscoggin Lake Watershed Survey and the Watershed-based Protection Plan.

Androscoggin Lake Association (ALIC) and 30 Mile River Watershed Association (30 Mile) are pleased to report that the Maine Department of Environmental Protection and the U.S. EPA have approved the Watershed-based Protection Plan for Androscoggin Lake. In issuing the approval, Maine DEP noted: "The [Androscoggin Lake] plan is well developed and outlines a solid framework to guide installation and maintenance of conservation practices and outreach to promote stewardship of the lake and its watershed. The plan provides a thorough summary of the watershed and water quality conditions and a clear action plan to protect water quality."

Achieving this important approval will now pave the way to apply for U.S. EPA grant funds to help correct shoreline and land use conditions that cause runoff pollution into the lake.
