As Pastor Angela wrote last month, we are welcoming a new Pastor to the Wayne Community Church on Saturday, July 1.

It is with mixed emotions that we say farewell and Godspeed to Pastor Angela and her husband Dan Rotherham. Angela will be missed by the community that she has faithfully served for the last four years. We are happy for her as she accepts this new appointment with the River Church Cooperative Parish, serving six different churches in the greater Augusta area and confident she will excel using her special gifts and talents for this new calling and opportunity.

In Angela's time with us she accomplished many goals including her vision of connections and bridges. She served as the Chaplain to the Wayne Fire Department, strengthened our ties within the community through Aging at Home, the Strawberry Festival, Wayne Village Stroll, Wayne Elementary School, and supported our local food banks. Under her leadership, and in cooperation with the Library we confronted difficult issues facing Maine and the nation. We have broadened our faith and understanding through Bible studies and welcomed new Members into the Church. New steps were taken to protect the environment through the installation of heat pumps in the sanctuary. Fundraising activities were undertaken for our Church and the wider Methodist Church. She further led us with tremendous spirit through the pandemic where she and Dan quickly adapted and embraced technology to keep our church family connected and worshiping together.

You may wonder why we see transitions of Pastors with some frequency at the Wayne Community Church. Well, it is one of the fundamental characteristics that distinguishes the United Methodist Church and it is how United Methodists have agreed to meet the pastoral needs of congregations. It is called "itinerancy" and refers to the commitment made by pastors before they are ordained or licensed, to go and serve wherever their bishop appoints them. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement was an "itinerant" preacher, who established the practice of traveling from town to town in England. When the Methodist movement started in the United States, a pastor or circuit rider was appointed to a circuit for a few months before going to a different circuit. This is why many United Methodist churches today have a historical tie to a circuit rider. In Wayne, our church was part of the Jesse Lee Cluster. As a Methodist Church, we benefit from the different skills and graces each new Pastor brings to our church and community.

We look forward to welcoming Reverend Marcos Juliao and his wife Pastor Mauren to Wayne. Pastor Marcos will be serving our church as well as the United Methodist Bartlett Church in North Jay. Pastor Mauren will be serving with Pastor Angela with the River Church Cooperative Parish. Please feel free to pick up a brief bio about Pastor Marcos located on the back table in the sanctuary and/or refer to the June Messenger.

One thing we all love and know about Wayne is our fun-packed summer months filled with events/activities to keep us all connected. Our new pastors typically arrive and find themselves in a whirlwind of happenings right on their doorstep and sometimes in their front yard! PRECIPE CORNER

Brazilian Cheese Bread

This typical Brazilian snack is lightly crunchy on the outside, soft and chewy on the inside, and has a cheese flavor that you will love. This bread is very easy to make and freezes well.

Ingredients: 1 cup of grated Parmesan cheese, 1 10oz. round of aged white cheddar (freshly grated) or Queso Fresco crumbled, 1 cup full-fat milk, 1/4 cup vegetable oil plus 1 Tbsp for oiling your hands, 2 eggs, 1 lb. tapioca flour (also known as tapioca starch), 2 tsp kosher salt.

Instructions: Preheat oven to 350F. Add tapioca flour and salt into a large bowl and whisk to combine. In a smaller bowl combine the cheese and eggs - set aside. Add the milk and oil to a small saucepan and bring to a simmer over medium heat. When the liquid simmers, remove from heat and immediately pour the hot liquid into the tapioca mixture. Stir with a wooden spoon - the mixture will be gummy and clumpy. Wait 5-10 minutes until the tapioca mixture is cool to touch (very important) then add the cheese/egg mixture to tapioca. Mix with a wooden spoon or hands to combine. The mixture should come together in a ball – you can see white tapioca specks in the


dough which is normal. With oil on

your hands scoop a tb spoon size

on baking sheet 2" apart. Bake for

30-35 minutes.

In observance of Independence Day, Tuesday, July 4, 2023, the Town Office and Transfer Station will be closed. It will re-open on Wednesday, July 5, 2023, during our regularly scheduled hours.

Due to the Strawberry Festival, Saturday, July 8, 2023, several village streets will be closed to traffic (Bridge Street, Lake Street, Memorial Park Lane) for the duration of the event, from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Several years ago, the Town adopted a Consumer Fireworks ban. Please respect this ban for everyone's safety and peaceful enjoyment of town.

The Town has an Animal Control Ordinance that states no domesticated animal, licensed or unlicensed, shall be permitted on Town property (highways, sidewalks, Ladd Recreation Center, parks, footbridge, Wayne Town House, North Wayne School House, Town Boat Launch, Fire Stations, or old Town Office) without a leash. The Town provides dog waste bags in the parks around the millpond, please be courteous to others who use these public facilities, and please pick up after your dogs.

During the month of July, the Town will be using the services of Craig Buzzell to conduct roadside mowing. They will be mowing all roadsides about 6 feet from the edge of the roadway. If you have anything valuable within the Town's Right-of-Way and are concerned about what might get hit by the mower, please don't hesitate to contact the Town Office.

CARY MEMORIAL LIBRARY NEWS







GO TAKE

A Hike!

Looking for a place to take a hike nearby, look no further than Wayne's 100-Acre Wood. It's a great way to get your mind off everyday trials and tribulations. A trailhead parking area is located on House Road, about ½ mile up from Old Winthrop Road. The Wayne Conservation Commission has established and marked a trail that leads from the parking area and loops around the western portion of the area. It traverses a rather unique variety of landforms, from relatively flat forested

land, to steep bolder ridden terrain and rock outcroppings. Evidence of the last glacier is everywhere. It's a great place to see songbirds, look for wildflowers, search for mushrooms, and possibly get a glimpse of a variety of animals that frequent the area.

The 100 Acre -Wood also reveals traces of years gone by. It was settled in the late 1700s when the Massachusetts Bay Colony transferred land to the Kennebec Proprietors, a group of wealthy land speculators. The land was surveyed, and lots were laid out from the Kennebec River west to what is Wayne today. Settlement of the area was promoted by the Proprietors, who found many eager to settle in the Maine wilderness. Some squatted on sites before they were "legally" purchased, and lived in fear of being evicted. Many settlers were from what is today eastern Massachusetts and Cape Cod, Sandwich in particular, where land was becoming scarce. They sailed from the Boston area to Portland or up the Kennebec River, and on to Hallowell and (Pond Town) Winthrop, and on past Wilson Pond to New Sandwich (Wayne) where they carved out an existence. The 1879 map of Wayne shows the road system of that period, and the location of different families. Several with the name House are depicted along the old House Road. Rock and cut granite cellar holes and stone walls are evidence of this period. The land was often only capable of supporting a subsistence existence, with sheep being a major cash crop. In the 19th century, many moved west to find more fertile soils to farm or to rapidly developing commercial centers along Maine's rivers. Today, it is predominately forest land with a variety of tree species, interesting terrain and geological features, and a diversity of wildlife.

The trail has a moderately easy northern loop that traverses the western portion of the property, and a less well-developed southward extension over rather steep and rugged terrain. Plan on taking two hours to traverse the entire trail, or just do the northern loop in much less time. Don't forget to take along bug repellent, wear long pants and tuck them into your socks to deter ticks, and bring along your binoculars and walking stick.
