

# WEEK ONE:

PEACE-SIGN BIRDSEED ORNAMENTS: cut a peace sign out of cardboard (or pick one up from church). Cover it in any nut butter and cover with bird seed. Repeat on second side. Press birdseed before stringing.

# WEEK TWO:



DRIED FRUIT ORNAMENTS: Slice any fruit (apple, orange, lemon, pear) and bake according to type of fruit. Can use dehydrator or air fryer as well. OR scoop out orange halves and fill emptied peel with birdseed.



# WEEK THREE:


MAKE ANY EDIBLE GARLAND:

String anything you can: popcorn, cranberries, peanuts in shells, dates, raisins, cheerios, fruit loops, oyster crackers!

# WEEK FOUR:

## HEART SHAPED EDIBLE ORNAMENTS:

Using a mixer, blend together 2/3 cup pumpkin puree, 1/4 cup peanut butter and 2 large eggs. Then slowly add flour, starting with 2 ½ cups, adding the last ½ cup as needed (until dough is no longer sticky). Remove from bowl and knead 3-4 times until dough comes together. Roll and cut into hearts. Bake on cookie sheet at 350 degrees until edges are golden (20-25 minutes).

#### ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING




#### December 5, 2021, at 11:15 a.m.

#### Green Team Tidbits: **Green Gift Wrap Ideas**

Many of you may already know that wrapping paper and gift bags with glitter, plastics, foil and other non-paper additives

are not recyclable. Try these green gift-wrapping suggestions to avoid these:

- If your gift includes a blanket or a piece of clothing, use it to wrap the package.
- Avoid the fancy wrapping paper and go with newsprint or packing paper to wrap gifts and holiday goodies.

- Paper bags from grocery stores are easy, reusable, and recyclable! Staple them closed, add a paper tag, and voila, your gift is ready. It's difficult to peek in this package!
- Use paper gift bags. Not only are they reusable, but they're recyclable if they do not contain glitter, plastics, foil and/or fabric handles

#### Christmas Giving Project 2021 -Gifts

The 2021 Christmas Giving Project will operate very similar to 2020 so that it is safe and easy for everyone

to contribute and participate. You, your family, and friends are invited to purchase gifts.

**WHAT:** The project offers five gifts to each child. Donors will receive a gift list that shows all gifts for a single child. We ask one person to register for the child even if you decide to share the gift purchasing for that child with a family member or friend. You can select any number of children.

**HOW:** You can make a request remotely by sending an email with Gift Request in the Subject line to: <u>hccChristmas@att.net</u>

Put three things in your email:

- 1) your name and phone number
- list the number of children you wish to purchase gifts for (remember, you will be responsible for five gifts for each child you request)
- Tell us your preference of the child's age:
   0 to 5 years old; 6 to 12 years old; or
   13 to 18 years old. You can include a gender preference, but that is not required.

You will receive a gift list and gift preparation instructions via return email. We will do our best to match your request.

You can also pick up a gift list from the gift table in Friendship Hall Sunday morning after worship, or Saturdays from 1-2pm just inside Door #1 (west side of building).

#### We welcome you to Worship with us!

In the spirit of inclusivity and welcoming, we offer three ways for you to worship with us:

- 1. <u>In person in the Sanctuary</u> There are some ways we are lowering risks as we gather inside to keep our community safer:
  - Currently, masks are required in the building, this includes during worship as we have young worshippers who cannot be vaccinated, and worshippers in higher risk categories.
  - Chairs are spaced out, and you can put an open seat holder on either side of your household to keep some distance.
  - Bulletins are distributed on paper and electronically if you prefer.
  - Music is one of the many important elements of worship at Haslett Community Church and will be part of our services. At this point, that doesn't include in person Congregational singing.
  - Please worship remotely if you answer 'yes' to any of the questions on the health checklist below.
- 2. <u>In the Parking Lot via radio</u> Want to be present at church, but you aren't quite ready to come in side? Join us in the parking lot!
  - Park near the sanctuary (south side is best), turn your radio to 88.7 FM, and turn up the volume. You will hear everything that our sound system picks up, and we can wave to you from the sanctuary! You can find the bulletin online HERE.
- 3. <u>Remote via Livestream</u> Continue to find the service each Sunday morning at <u>haslettcommunitychurch.org</u> or on our <u>YouTube channel</u>. You can find the bulletin online **HERE**.

After many years of service, Paul White has retired as **Food Drive Coordinator** with our thanks for his faithful operation of this im-




portant part of the Haslett Food Pantry resources. We are hopeful that someone will step forward to fill this position so that we do not need to turn down any food drive offers.
