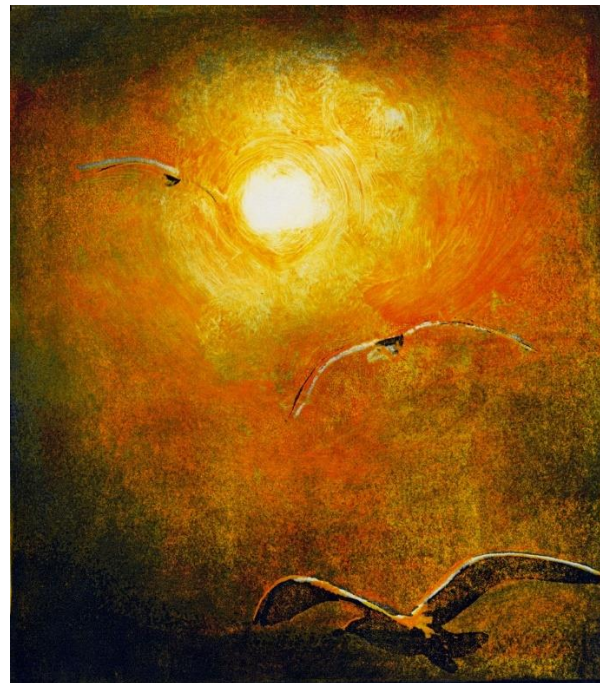
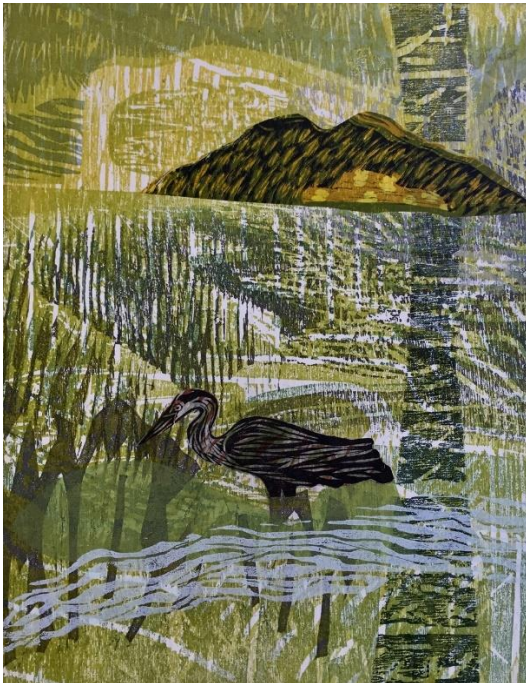
Santa Barbara Printmakers showcases *Wild Places in Print* in Wildling Museum's Barbara Goodall Education Center

(SOLVANG, CA) – The Wildling Museum is pleased to announce *Santa Barbara Printmakers: Wild Places in Print*, a new Barbara Goodall Education Center exhibition featuring nature and wildlife-inspired works by more than 30 members of the Santa Barbara Printmakers (SBP) group. The exhibition is on view now through January 13, 2020 in the Wildling Museum's third floor classroom.

Soaring birds, colorful layered foliage, a delicate barn owl, coastal vistas, and bold graphic butterflies are among nearly 100 different prints on view.

The Santa Barbara Printmakers is a group of artists working in a range of printmaking techniques that span traditional and digital methods. For this exhibition, artists created works inspired by native Central Coast wildlife, vegetation, landscapes, and abstractions using techniques ranging from drypoint, linocuts, monoprints, monotypes, relief woodcuts, screenprinting, polymer intaglio, and more.

An opening reception with the artists will take place Saturday, October 26, 2019, 3 - 4:30 p.m. at the Wildling Museum and on Sunday, January 12, 2020, the Wildling Museum will host an interactive panel discussion and demonstration with select printmakers from 3 – 4:30 p.m. Admission for the event is \$5 for Wildling Museum Members and \$10 for Non-Members.
