## LOGLINE

A sheriff comes under fire when two S.B.I. agents question his involvement in an unsolved murder case that shares distinct similarities with a recent homicide.

## SYNOPSIS

In 1997, outside the small town of Abeithorn, North Carolina, Roseanne Barnes was brutally killed near her mountainside home. The last person to see her alive? A rookie cop: Officer Jefferies. Twenty years later the murder remains unsolved. The once young man, now sheriff, is questioned by two S.B.I. agents about that night. As he recounts the events, the investigators grow suspicious that Jefferies is withholding details that could unravel what happened to Roseanne and how her murder may be connected to a recent homicide - less than a mile from where she was found on Miner's Mountain.



## DIRECTOR'S BIO



Bennett Pellington is an international award-winning filmmaker who got his start directing and producing commercials and music videos. He co-wrote, produced, directed and edited the short film, **The Visitor**, which won the Best Acting Award in the 2015 MyRodeReel film competition. Regarded as the largest online short film festival in the world, **The Visitor**, also placed in the top finalists for: Best Drama, Best Cinematography, Best Behind the Scenes, and Judges' Choice Best Film.

Ben's films and music videos have played in many festivals across a variety of different platforms throughout the U.S. and Europe. His film, **South By Southwest** won first place in the Hitchcock Challenge on the popular Youtube channel Film Riot.

Pellington has worked alongside award-winning filmmakers like producer Jay Van Hoy (**The Witch, The Lighthouse**), and Oscar winner, Alan Ball (**American Beauty, True Blood**), gaining insight and firsthand knowledge. He is currently writing two spec features and the pilot episode of **Miner's Mountain**.

## DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

The inspiration for **Miner's Mountain** began in summer 2011. Our family was staying at a remote cabin, and my younger sister relentlessly pestered our dad into telling a scary story. He made up the foundation of Miner's Mountain on the spot. He started by saying he didn't know any scary stories, but he came across an article on the internet earlier that worried him. A few days before we checked in, a local wildlife ranger responded to a call regarding strange screams in close proximity to our cabin. A deer carcass was found, the ranger reported hearing shrieks and rushed back to the office. The woman who originally called was later reported missing. Local law enforcement investigated and issued a warning to the mountain residents to be on alert for a rabid animal or an unwell individual.

My room had floor to ceiling windows that faced the long gravel road traveling up the ravine. It was a full moon that night, and all I could imagine while staring out those windows was a dark figure slowly creeping down the driveway.

Needless to say, I didn't sleep.

Over the years that made up story stayed with me. And as fun as it was imagining who or what made those sounds, I kept coming back to the ranger. There had to be more. If he heard something, why didn't he investigate further? Did he see something he wasn't supposed to? Did he have something to do with the missing person? This became the basis for Miner's Mountain.

I'm attracted to characters with a guilty conscience and the experience I'm most trying to relay in this film is that of identity. How we see ourselves, how others see what they want to see, and the choices we make that ultimately reveal who we really are.

### SHERIFF JEFFERIES - HENRY BAZEMORE, JR.



Upon graduating from the University of Michigan, Henry was accepted to The University of Georgia on a full ride scholarship. He supplemented his education at the Actor's Studio in Atlanta and on the professional stage.

He's played title roles such as Henry in Henry V, Cassius in Julius Caesar, and Theseus and Oberon in A Midsummer Night's Dream. He appeared in a number of television shows such as Drop Dead Diva, Sleepy Hollow, and Homeland, while recurring in Army Wives, One Tree Hill and The Red Road.





Anthony began his career at the Lee Strasberg Theatre Institute in 1995 and later continued his studies at the Beverly Hills Playhouse. Since then he has worked on a vast amount of films and TV shows playing titular characters opposite the likes of Edward Norton, Bruce Dern and friend, Billy Bob Thornton.

He has won numerous awards and accolades not only for acting, but his writing and producing work has proven successful. He co-wrote, starred in, and produced the award winning short film **Times Like Dying** and produced the SXSW audience award winner, **That Evening Sun**.

Myke earned his BA in Theatre from the University of North Carolina Wilmington. He then went on to earn his MFA from Northern Illinois University where he studied under master acting teacher Kathryn Gately. After graduating he continued his studies at the world-famous Moscow Art Theatre in Russia.

As a professional actor, Myke has worked in theatres in Russia, Romania, New York, Los Angeles, and all across the southeastern United States. ## FAQ

## Q: How long did it take to make this film?

I wrote the script in early 2014 and we shot for 3 nights in July that same year. On paper, we all felt like we had a good story. But after finishing the cut, I could tell we were missing something and I couldn't let it go. The story was there but the arc wasn't. It was more of a few scenes compiled together as a set-up and the original ending was way too vague. For 2 ½ years I revisited the edit every once in a while, trying to will some sort of arc out of it. Then one day I was jogging and had a eureka moment. Use what we shot as flashbacks and write new content with the main character set in present day. That was interesting because, not only did it add more conflict and complete the story arc, but it answered the questions I originally daydreamed about. If he heard something, what prevented him from investigating further? And if he saw or did something he didn't want people to know about, how did he get away with it and why? It gave the story a whole new outlook for me. So, using the original script as a roadmap to weave truth and fiction, I wrote the present day scenes. In August 2017 we shot for 3 more days. This time it felt right and we were proud of the story we told. Only problem was, we ran out of money for post production.

For almost 2 years I worked and saved what I could to fund our post budget. We met our goal and completed the film on July 1st, 2019 - over 5 years since I wrote the first draft.

## Q: Where did you shoot?

In 2014 we shot in Boone, North Carolina at a cabin in the Blue Ridge Parkway. And in 2017 we shot at various locations around Wilmington, North Carolina.

#### Q: How will the film be seen?

Currently we are doing a festival run and possibly a museum screening. Alex Harris, an accomplished photographer, reached out to me before principal photography in 2017 and explained he had been commissioned by the High Museum of Art in Atlanta to create an exhibition depicting independent cinema in the south. He asked to be a part of Miner's Mountain and I said absolutely. For 2 years he traveled up and down the southeast, capturing beautiful behind the scenes photos. I'm proud to have our film featured and consider myself lucky to have him play a role in the making of.
