

# End of Year Report 2021

### 2021 Major Achievements



- 522 bolts replaced
- Added 5 miles of trails to the Boulder Canyon Trails System
- 7,429+ volunteer hours = \$212,000+ value
- Over 3,000 wag bags distributed
- 3,500 feet of trail built--most ever
- Advocacy: Eldorado State Park, Rocky Mountain National Park, Clear Creek Canyon and Flagstaff Mountain
- Installed 13 Crag Stewardship Kiosks to local gyms
- Trained 40+ new rebolt volunteers
- Doubled membership







#### 2022 Goals





- Strategic Planning: 5 Year Plan for BCC Operations and Fundraising
- Increase bolt replacement by 20%
- Complete 11 weeks of trail work at Avalon and Upper Dream Canyon



- Hold 6-stewardship days (crag clean-ups)
- Increase climber connectivity-outreach in the Front Range Zone (aka greater Denver Metro area)
- Increase total membership by 30%
- Increase member-only events
- Increase volunteer participation by 20%







Expenses (in order of magnitude): salaries and benefits, insurance, tools and supplies (drill bits, bolts, etc.), and wag bags.









# Anchor Replacement Program 2021:

- 522 bolts replaced on 81 routes
- Five crag makeover events in Boulder Canyon: Bowling Alley, Sherwood Forest/Witches Tower, Black Widow Slab, Easter Rock, and Sport Park
- 700 volunteer labor hours
- Twenty hardware grants distributed for routes in Clear Creek to Rocky Mountain National Park
- Five rebolt training clinics held
- 40 new rebolt volunteers trained

### Human Waste Program

One emoji to sum up 2022: . This has been the busiest year for wag bags in program history with over 3,000 bags distributed at 15 stations and 13 gym kiosk. Major highlights include:

- Wag bags available for members at participating local gyms
- Keeping 1500 pounds plus of waste out of the watershed.
- Grant received for creation of "poop plan" educational video in 2022
- New educational sticker designed by local artist Lois Kempney @loisthelittleart





### Advocacy

#### The BCC Advocacy Committee found its feet in 2021:

- Submitted joint comment letter to Eldorado Canyon State Park to advocate for climbers and avoid a problematic permit system in the new Management Plan
- Submitted joint comment letter to Rocky Mountain National Park to advocate for climber's needs in new Day Use Visitor Access
   Plan
- Worked with Boulders Open Space and Mountain Parks to ensure night time access at Flagstaff Mountain bouldering areas
- Worked with the US Forest Service to successfully convert all major climber access trails in Boulder Canyon into official system trails. This is a huge win because it opens the door for the BCC and climbers to complete much needed stewardship work. This was eleven years of advocacy work coming to fruition.
