

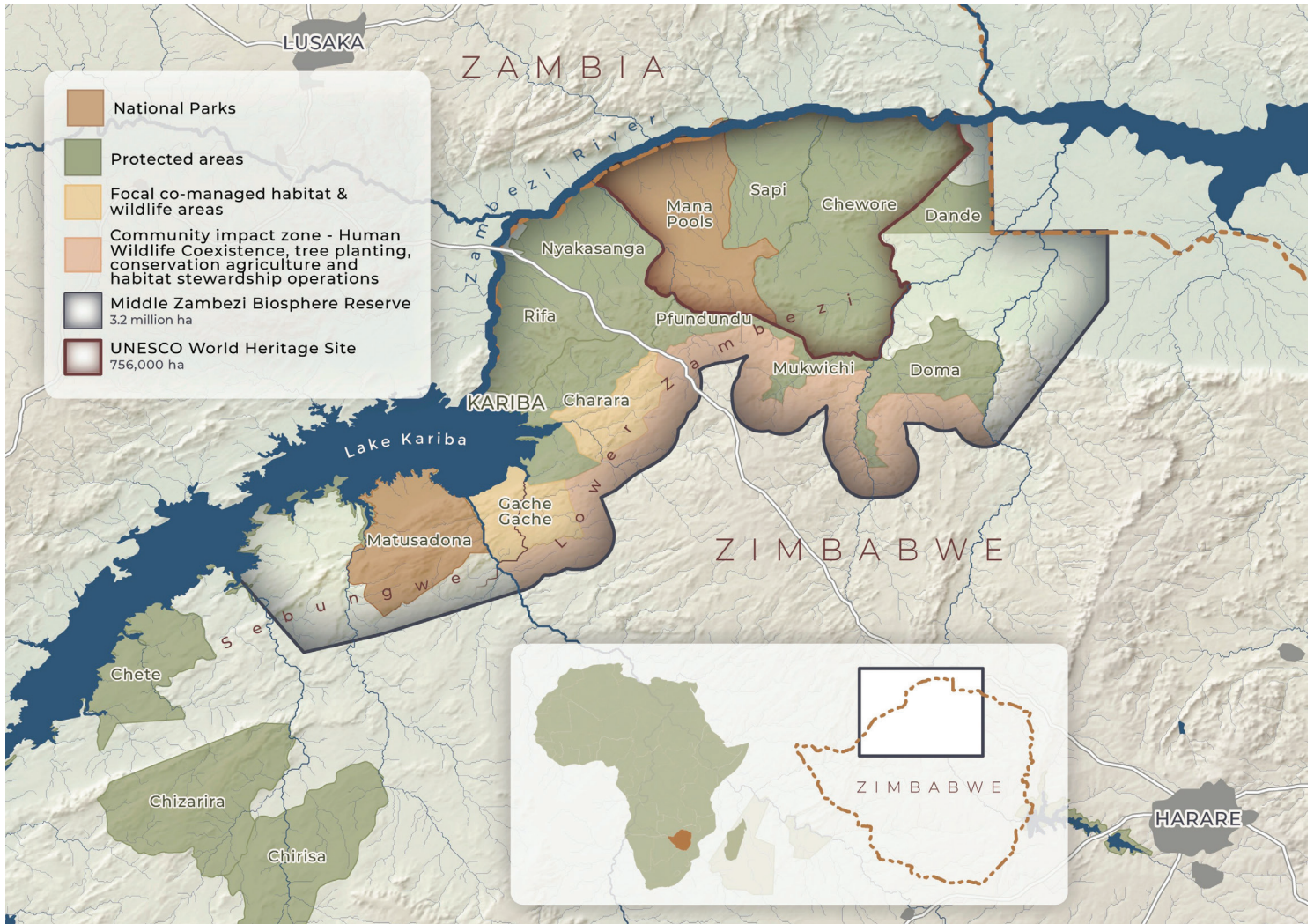

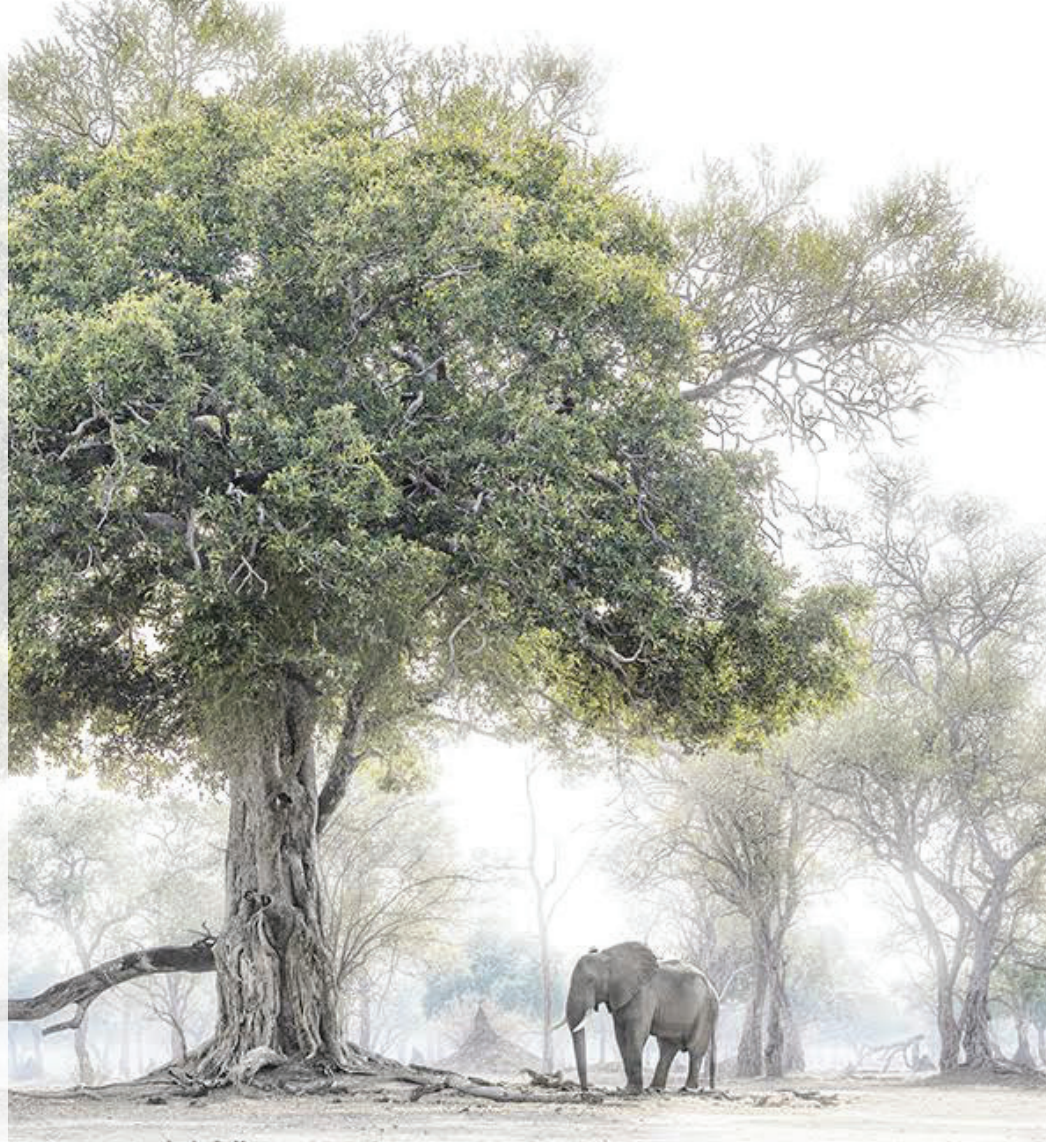




# 2022 AMBITION PROPOSAL
