Sermon Introduction

We continue in this powerful series that examines specific elements of God's grace to us titled, *How Sweet the Sound*. In keeping with the theme of this life-changing series, and in celebration of Black History Month, today we examine "*Grace for Your Soul: God's Grace to Humanity Through the Music of American Negro Spirituals*," a distinct collection of songs created by African slaves in the United States.

I was first exposed to these songs as a little boy growing up in the southern part of the United States. I remember my grandmother singing and humming these songs as she worked around the house, or sometimes I would hear these songs sung at church. Later, I gained a greater appreciation for these songs through my high school and college years when I sang them myself. It was during this time that I realized the tremendous power of these songs to bring healing and restoration to the human soul.

This presentation will help define these inspired songs, explain how they came into existence, the purpose they served, the impact they have had on the Christian church, and how God used the soul songs of slaves to bless the entire world. Also, woven into today's message are selections of popular American Negro spirituals. As you worship God today, relax, receive His blessing, and embrace God's amazing grace for your soul through the music of American Negro Spirituals.
