

Mission

Voices of young people (of all ages) worldwide increase awareness of climate change impact on seeds, and creatively inspire and engage the general public.



Seeds of Hope

Stronger together

- Young people/educators/scientists/artists/local communities
- Schools (open days) decorated with 'Make a Difference with Just One Seed Story' messages by young people
- Seed Banks (Local/National) contribution of scientific information* to suggest, or donate, seeds that would improve local biodiversity.

Impact of Climate Change on Seeds Four Seasons Approach

Young people (and possibly Seed Banks) gift seeds and bulbs to local communities to:

- Sow seed stories [Spring]
- Exhibit story images/ideas [Summer]
- Use stories to create ideas for a community legacy project [Autumn]
- Celebrate a cultural and artistic climate change legacy [Winter – and beyond].



Impact of Climate Change on Seeds Young People Ask Seed Banks Four Seasons Questions

Q1: [Spring] What should we plant to improve local biodiversity?

Q2: [Summer] How will we know if our 'Make a Difference with Just One Seed Story' messages are working?

Q3: [Autumn] What more should we do locally to support biodiversity?

Q4: [Winter] What can we celebrate about our local work together - are we making a difference with our Seeds of Hope for a Better Future?
