What if I don't have time to read this whole thing?

> Call 211, a free, confidential service to help you find resources in your community (<u>nc211.org</u>)

What if I've been laid off or had my hours reduced?

> Governor Cooper has loosened the requirements for receiving unemployment benefits. If you've been laid off OR HAD YOUR HOURS REDUCED, apply online: https://des.nc.gov/need-help/covid-19-information

>If you lose your employer-sponsored health insurance, or experience a change in your job status, you may be eligible for subsidized plans under the Affordable Care Act: healthcare Avigators: https://www.ncnavigator.net/

What if I can't pay my rent or mortgage?

- > For homeowners nationwide, foreclosures and evictions have been frozen until the end of April. Many lenders are allowing homeowners to postpone mortgage payments for up to a year.
- > North Carolina has ordered a 30-day halt to eviction proceedings for renters, but some previously-filed proceedings are still being carried out. If you are threatened with eviction, call Legal Aid at 1-866-219-5262 or visit their website: legalaidnc.org

*We need more help for tenants! We need a rent freeze supported by government payments, not just postponements. Tenants cannot pay huge bills after the crisis passes!

What if I can't pay my utility, phone, and internet bills?

- > Raleigh Water, Dominion Energy, and Duke Energy have suspended disconnections. Duke is waiving late fees. IF YOUR POWER WAS ALREADY SHUT OFF BY DOMINION, THEY WILL RECONNECT IT. Call 866-366-4357.
- > Call 211 to find out if you qualify for longer-term government assistance with energy bills.
- > Spectrum/Charter is offering free internet service for 60 days to households with children, who do not have accounts: 1-844-488-8395. Comcast is providing free internet for low-income families and a permanent low-cost (slow) basic service: https://corporate.comcast.com/covid-19
- *We need free internet for everyone, not just families with children. Schools and libraries are closed. In a public health emergency, everyone needs access to information!
- > Verizon and AT&T are suspending terminations for nonpayment and waiving late fees. T-mobile is offering to set up payment plans. All three are expanding minutes for customers on limited plans and offering additional international calling to affected countries.
- > Lifeline is a federal program that provides subscribers a discount on monthly telephone service: https://www.lifelinesupport.org/how-to-get-lifeline
