 - Chairs should be creating dedicated Committee Groups
 - Very helpful to disseminate information/serve as reference for members not in a given Committee on updates from the various Committees
- c. Brief Updates from each board member on how their summer internships are going/went
 - i. President
 - Been back in Boulder for about two weeks
 - Getting ready to get back to classes
 - ii. Vice President
 - Still at internship with First Peoples Worldwide, continuing the internship into the school year to finish up major project and to likely expand into new projects
 - Hopefully going to Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues in U.N. at New York – Spring 2023, April or May
 - a. An indigenous-focused forum
 - iii. Secretary
 - Wrapping up Clerkship with the Navajo Nation Chief Prosecutor on August 26th
 - Applying to Prosecutor position, hopeful that he is able to continue serving Navajo Nation in a prosecutorial-esque capacity
 - iv. Treasurer
 - o ABSENT
 - v. PR Director
 - High point: going great, last week of work got to do oral moot court against one of fellow clerks, thought it went well
 - Ready to have a little more flexibility in his schedule to work on National NALSA now that orienting toward school year
 - Low point: UHAUL conundrums moving back to school year residence

 - Finished internship on Friday, drove eight hours on Saturday, two on Sunday – Big Fire a newer law firm, should look out for new grad position, got soft offer for job after graduation

- Office of the Prosecutor already have Navajo Nation Bar license and, like the Secretary, also applying to a Prosecutor position to work during the school year and afterward

- Wrapped up DOJ internship
- Rose: getting to watch fireworks on DOI building in D.C. with Secretary Haaland
- Thorn: right after finished internship, broke ankle, have walking cast
- ix. Rep. SparrowSmith
 - o ABSENT
- x. Rep. Bilagody
 - Finished internship with Gila River Office of the Prosecutor, got to get ready to head back to Michigan - flying back tomorrow
- xi. Rep. Russell
 - High point: completed with U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado - don't want to do criminal law in practice - know that after this summer at the very least;
 - Low points: a lot of research in multi-million dollar civil case, settled a day before trial was supposed to start, was excited to see how that trial would have played out
 - a. Started 2L year, most excited for Copyright Law, which piques interest greatly may pursue that in practice
 - i. Find investigation of illegally downloaded
- xii. Rep. Lesansee
 - Finished with American Indian Law Center Pre-Law Summer Institute, which is having its 55th Anniversary celebration with Secretary Haaland in near future
 - a. May ask for NNALSA Executive Board member to attend
- xiii. Rep. Jimmicum
 - ABSENT school conflict
- xiv. Rep. Goodrich
 - Continuing research position with Prof. EagleWoman during school year
 - Low was MPRE, husband rear-ended shortly after she took that test;
 - Classes started yesterday
- xv. Any other announcements on other topics
 - None
- 6. Old/Recurring Business
 - a. Presentations from selected Committee Chairs on updates with their work efforts
 - i. Mid-Year/Annual Conference -
 - Mid-Year conference
 - a. Rep. Bilagody:
 - Trying to figure out dates that would work well for everyone

- ii. One date range was October 27th 29th, with 27th being fly-in date; 28th being full day; and 29th wrapping up around noon; Thursday to Saturday
 - 1. This will most likely be the date range chosen
- iii. Looking at Denver area for potential location
 - Quite likely going to be the ultimate location choice
- iv. Airbnb possibility doing a retreat style approach rather than hotels

b. President:

- i. We could fit everyone in same place; do most of our own stuff at the Airbnb
- ii. Reserve spots at University of Colorado Law School for outside speakers and other matters that
- iii. Everyone please fill out email that President will be sending out

Annual:

- a. No discussion on this point
- ii. Moot Court Planning Update, Administrator:
 - Finalized the team amount at 30, which is smaller than previous competitions, last year (2022) there were about 44
 - a. OU's College of Law is physically smaller than other schools; school administrators had expressed concern that matter was too large if tried to do 44
 - February 25th and 26th are the solidified dates; last Saturday and Sunday of February, which is the same week as last year (that is, for the 2022 Moot Court Competition during the 2021-2022 school year)
 - c. Budget sitting on Dean's desk for budget approval
 - d. Won't need to do any outside fundraising to pay for cost of Competition; Dean preferred to fund internally
 - Using network at OU to coordinate and plan process; assigned
 OU Committee Chairs and have Head Bailiff confirmed
 - Making steady consistent progress on selecting Judges
 - Working on graphic design process to craft logo for the 2023 Competition
 - Once get back on campus will be able to make even further progress, so even more updates to be expected during September meeting
 - Good tentative schedule thus far, on schedule (perhaps ahead?)
 - Two teams per school maximum sticking to that strict limit
- iii. Career Committee, Rep. Russell, Chair:
 - Update on job board matter
 - a. Compiled list of employers, a couple of big law firms, tribal courts, etc.
 - b. Should we continue to use the NNALSA website to post job boards or preferable to send to Chapter leaders to disburse to their members?
 - c. Planning to meet with committee members every two weeks, planning to seek practicing indigenous attorneys to

discuss variety of topics specific to navigating any workspace, but especially non-tribal-governmental workspaces regarding micro-aggressions and other concerns new indigenous lawyers might face

- Administrator: very much preferable to lay out blueprint for future indigenous lawyers as it is quite difficult always having to ford out on path without much indigenous quidance, if any
 - a. That is, many new indigenous lawyers have to figure out their own paths in their new careers because the lessons longer-practicing indigenous lawyers have learned in their careers have not been memorialized for future new indigenous lawyers
- iv. Advocacy Meeting, Vice President, Chair:
 - Matters to discuss at next Advocacy meeting:
 - a. Different responses to Brackeen v. Haaland
 - Indigenizing curriculum packet for first-year students, update - including advice for native students to be able to navigate certain legal discussions (e.g., boarding schools and related government-sponsored/sanctioned abuses)
 - c. Responses to recent SCOTUS Indian Law cases
 - If on Committee and have not responded to When2Meet link please do so promptly; can send out link again
 - Will confer with President before sending out any Advocacy matters before the Committee does so on NNALSA's behalf
 - Inviting those members not on committee to provide suggested topics/items for the Committee's consideration
- v. Finance Committee Updates, Treasurer, Chair ABSENT
 - President: committee members should look out for email this week that President expects Treasurer will be sending
- vi. PR Committee, PR Director, Chair
 - Swag updates have some design updates, moving forward
 - No additional PR updates
- vii. By-laws Committee, President, Chair
 - o Proposed changes so far:
 - a. Removing rule that a member of the NNALSA Board cannot be a member of their local chapter's board
 - Reasoning: discourages small start-up chapters from greater involvement in NNALSA
 - Removing distinctions of membership between law students who are members of tribes/descendants of members of tribes and non-Indians
 - c. Any other tentative proposed changes to by-laws
 - Meeting with Committee sometime this week ideally, another by-law we will seek to update is the remote participation protocol
- 7. New Business
 - a. President's update on Bank of America bank account issues
 - i. Filled out relevant paperwork, anticipate becoming signer for NNALSA in very near future
 - b. Model Local By-Laws Draft, President:
 - i. Working with Clayton to draft model local by-laws

- c. New Ole Miss NALSA Chapter pursuant to that Chapter's request, President & Secretary
 - i. Passed unanimously
 - ii. President will draft letter accepting and Secretary will co-sign
- d. Absence Tracker Explanation, President & Secretary:
 - Keeping track of everyone's absences, only reason one gets strike is if they have an unexcused absence; will provide notice after two unexcused absences
- e. Google Sheet for Representatives to keep track of their communications with Chapter Presidents and to keep NNALSA Board apprised of best contact information for Chapter Presidents
 - i. Secretary explanation contact information for each chapter key to keeping individual chapters engaged from year-to-year
 - ii. Rep. Goodrich: whether or not *chapter* dues have been paid; good to keep track ahead of Moot Court Competition
 - iii. Rep. Littlefoot: point of contact for faculty sponsor would be ideal, especially because law students are not going to be there as long as faculty sponsors
 - Unclear if Board contact for local chapters up-to-date
- f. Approving Minutes from June 20, 2022 and July 18, 2022 Meetings
 - i. Reading by Secretary
 - ii. Motion: President
 - iii. Second: Rep. Lesansee
 - iv. Result: Approved unanimously
- g. Representatives' Updates on Communications with Chapter Leaders, if any
 - Rep. Welsh University of Denver chapter and CU Boulder chapter jointly planning to meet federal court judges and Colorado Supreme Court for Indian law symposium
- h. Representatives sending welcome-back emails to chapter leaders, Secretary:
 - i. Contents of welcome-back should include, inter alia:
 - Notice that NNALSA Board Elections for 2023 2024 school year will take place in late March
 - a. Nominations will be open in early March, exact date TBA
 - Chapter leaders should bring the opportunity of running for NNALSA Board to their members repeatedly throughout the school year
 - Explanation of timeline of Moot Court Competition (details to be provided to Representatives by Administrator)
 - Goal of encouraging first-time and re-registrations as a NNALSA member - need to be a NNALSA dues-paying member to participate in NNALSA Moot Court 2023 Competition
 - b. Request that Chapter Presidents make sure their schools have re-registered as official NALSA local chapters
 - Generally explain that Representatives are a resource for Chapter Presidents and they should reach out to Representatives with any questions they have during the year
 - Encouraging local chapters to start considering now whether they would be open to hosting the NNALSA 2024 Moot Court Competition or Writing Competition

- Any other information that the Board recommends be included:
 - Administrator: idea of having local chapter moot court director to ensure institutional memory from year-to-year such that one person has role of communicating who local chapters' coaches were each year
 - Eldred: highlighting any NNALSA events over next semester in welcome-back email; some local chapters very interested in updates on that
 - i. President: clarifying that Midyear is for NNALSA Board while Annual is for everyone in NNALSA
 - ii. President: encouraged to host local mult-chapter meetings
 - iii. President: ask chapters to send photos and updates of events that they're hosting on local campuses for NNALSA to share
 - iv. Eldred: encouraging local chapters to piggy-back off of undergraduate indigenous students orgs.
 - c. Secretary: need to pay dues in order to attend Annual Conference as well as Writing and Moot Court Competition
 - d. President: grants only payable to dues-paying chapters

ii. President - membership dues update

- Some representatives have asked about the status of chapter dues having been paid by individual NALSA chapters in their areas; only eight chapters so far have renewed their registrations for the 2022-2023 school year
- Big chunk of our funding is chapter and individual membership dues
- i. Discussion Points Added During Agenda Approval/During the Meeting:
 - i. President: reminder all NNALSA board members need to get one sponsor during this year, need one
 - Exemption: Administrator, who encouraged other members to reach out to Big Fire Law Firm (at which he interned this past summer), which could be a potential sponsor
