Series Explanation: A Real Christmas


WORSHIP NOTES: 4th Sunday in Advent



Silent prayer


We remember with thanksgiving those who have loved and served you, who now rest from their labors, *[especially...here name the person]*. Console those who are mourning or living with sadness.


