• ACTivate – ARTIST, CITIZEN, THEATER MAKER

Created a new program that puts community in the "artist driver's seat". ACTivate stands for ARTIST, CITIZEN, THEATER MAKER and explores what it means to create theater as a "citizen artist" in New York City and the world. The program began in 2016 with an original piece called TROY, inspired by Euripides' The Trojan Women, in which a neighborhood is reckoning with the devastating loss of one of their own. Our ensemble interviewed everyday New Yorkers about family, memory, loss, and hard won joy in order to explore the way grief affects an entire community. Though each production is created differently, ACTivate follows the artistic impulse of the community who engage in every aspect of the creative process.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMUNITY CHOIR
