Are there any discounted tickets available?



**FINAL FLIGHT FLINAL FIGHT:
My grandmother, the WASP, and Arlington National Cemetery**

Erin Miller is the proud granddaughter of Elaine Danforth Harmon, a member of the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) during WWII. Her grandmother's last request was to be laid to rest at Arlington National Cemetery (ANC). After she died in April 2015, this request was denied by the US Army which runs ANC. Erin led a grassroots, social media, and direct lobbying campaign to fight the decision. This campaign was a success.

Erin is a licensed attorney in Maryland. She has a J.D. from the University of Maryland School of Law, a Master's in International Studies from the University of Leeds (UK), and a B.A. in History from the University of California, San Diego.


PUTTING GIRLS IN THEIR RIGHTFUL PLACE... IN THE HISTORY BOOKS




