The GLBT Historical Society also maintains the San Francisco LGBTQ Sites Database, listing nearly 2,000 LGBTQ historic sites. The resource was created by Willie Walker and Eric Garber for the San Francisco Lesbian and Gay History Project; it was transferred to the society in 1985. It includes later additions by Elizabeth A. Armstrong and Damon Scott. The data is searchable by site type, site name, location, dates, description and citations.
