Manuscript Collections

Sylvester collection (2018-05). Sylvester (1947-1988) was a famed Black, genderqueer, disco performer and singer-songwriter. The collection contains performance costumes, family photographs, press materials, awards, albums, and personal items such as hand-made jewelry made by Sylvester.

Todd Trexler collection (2006-33). This collection contains posters and original artwork by Todd Trexler. The collection includes Sylvester posters along with many other performers.

Erik Nielsen papers (1992-14). The Erik Nielsen papers contain materials related to his career as a party producer in the 1970s and 1980s. He worked in Artist Management with Fantasy Records, where he represented Sylvester and other artists. The collection includes publicity material, including photographs, and other material related to Sylvester.

Photographs

Collection of slides of black gay events (1997-39). These slides were found after the death of their owner, an African-American gay man. They document gay African-American concerts and dances. Includes a number of images of the disco diva, Sylvester.

Mick Hicks photographs (1998-49). Mick Hicks is a prolific photographer. The collection includes a number of photographs of Sylvester and other subjects.

Daniel Nicoletta slides (1999-02). This collection contains thirty slides of photos depicting Sylvester, Divine, and the Cockettes during performances and events throughout the 1970s and 1990s. The images are by Nicoletta and other photographers.

Crawford Wayne Barton papers (1993-11). Barton is best known as a photographer of San Francisco's gay culture in the 1970s. The collection includes photographs of Sylvester.
