1. What does sanctification mean?

- Sanctification ἀγιασμός (hagiasmos), οῦ (ou), ὁ (ho): n.masc.;
- sanctification, holiness, i.e., dedication to the Lord, and/or dedication to moral purity (Ro 6:19, 22; 1Co 1:30; 1Th 4:3, 4, 7; 2Th 2:13; 1Ti 2:15; Heb 12:14; 1Pe 1:2+)
- n. masc. sanctification, holiness, consecration. <u>Refers either to the process of becoming holy</u>, by which the state of holiness is attained, or to the end result that the sanctifying work has obtained. <u>The term hagiasmos is derived from the verb ἀγιάζω (hagiazō, "to make holy")</u> and occurs in the NT only in the letters. It can refer to the process of becoming holy, often translated as "sanctifying" or "sanctification." It can also refer to the state of holiness, the result of being sanctified. This is presented as a moral goal to be pursued (Heb 12:14), as outward conduct (1 Tim 2:15), and as the product of Christ's atoning work (1 Cor 1:30). Christians can obtain sanctification by submitting their body to the sanctifying work of the Spirit (2 Thess 2:13; 1 Pet 1:2).

2. What is sanctification?

- 1 Corinthians 15:31 I protest by your rejoicing which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, I die daily.
- The battle for self is life-long:
- 1 Timothy 6:12 Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses.
- 2 Timothy 4:7 I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith.

3. Is a daily conversion needed in order to maintain sanctification?

- 2 Corinthians 4:16 For which cause we faint not; but though our outward man perish, yet the <u>inward man</u> is renewed <u>day by day</u>.
- Colossians 3:8–11 8 But now ye also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth. 9 Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds; 10 And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him: 11 Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond nor free: but Christ is all, and in all.

4. Does a converted or sanctified person ever fall or make mistakes?

- **Psalm 37:23–24** ²³ The steps of a *good* man are ordered by the LORD: and he delighteth in his way. ²⁴ Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down: for the LORD upholdeth *him with* his hand.
- **Proverbs 24:16** For a just *man* falleth seven times, and riseth up again: but the wicked shall fall into mischief.
- 1 John 2:1-2 My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.

5. Sanctification is a continual growing in grace:

• Acts 20:32 - And now, brethren, I commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them which are <u>sanctified</u>.

6. Can one fail in growing in the grace of God?

- **Hebrews 12:14–15** ¹⁴ Follow peace with all *men*, and <u>holiness</u>, without which no man shall see the Lord: ¹⁵ Looking diligently lest any man <u>fail of the grace of God</u>; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble *you*, and thereby many be defiled.
- Failing can mean "come short of" "fail to reach." If we are not growing in holiness/sanctification then we are not allowing the grace of God to change us (Titus 2:11-12)

7. How do I grow in sanctification? (By spending time with God):

• Ezekiel 20:12,20 - 12 Moreover also I gave them my sabbaths, to be a sign between me and them, that they might know that I am the LORD that sanctify them... 20 And hallow my sabbaths; and they shall be a sign between me and you, that ye may know that I am the LORD your God.

8. Sanctification is a growth in spirituality and holiness

Philippians 3:12–14 - ¹² Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus. ¹³ Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, ¹⁴ I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

Example:

- Hebrews 6:1 go on unto perfection
- Ephesians 4:11–13 We grow up unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ.

9. What are the steps one needs to take in order to experience sanctification?

• 2 Peter 1:3-11 - 3 According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that *pertain* unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue: 4 Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine





nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. ⁵ And beside this, giving all diligence, <u>add</u> to your **faith virtue**; and to **virtue knowledge**; ⁶ And to **knowledge temperance**; and to **temperance patience**; and to **patience godliness**; ⁷ And to **godliness brotherly kindness**; and to **brotherly kindness charity**. ⁸ For if these things be in you, and abound, they make *you that ye shall* neither *be* barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. ¹⁰ Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: **for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall**: ¹¹ For so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

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
