# Polis overperformed Clinton both statewide, and especially in key suburban counties

## Democratic Share of the Vote

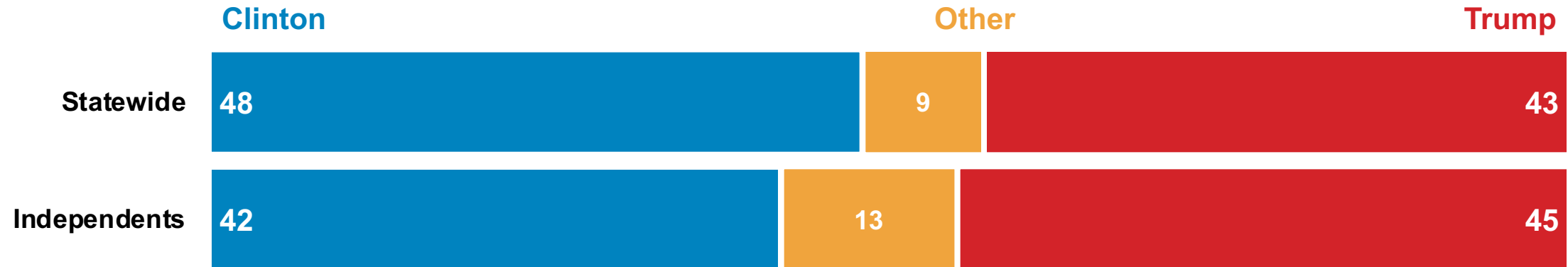
County	% Polis '18	Polis vs. Clinton	% Clinton '16	% Obama '12
Statewide	52%	+4.1	48%	51%
Jefferson County	54%	+5.3	49%	51%
Adams County	55%	+4.6	50%	57%

In a state with roughly equal Dems and Republicans, Independents are key. Polis won them big to improve on Hillary's margin

Colorado Exit Poll – GSG (2018)

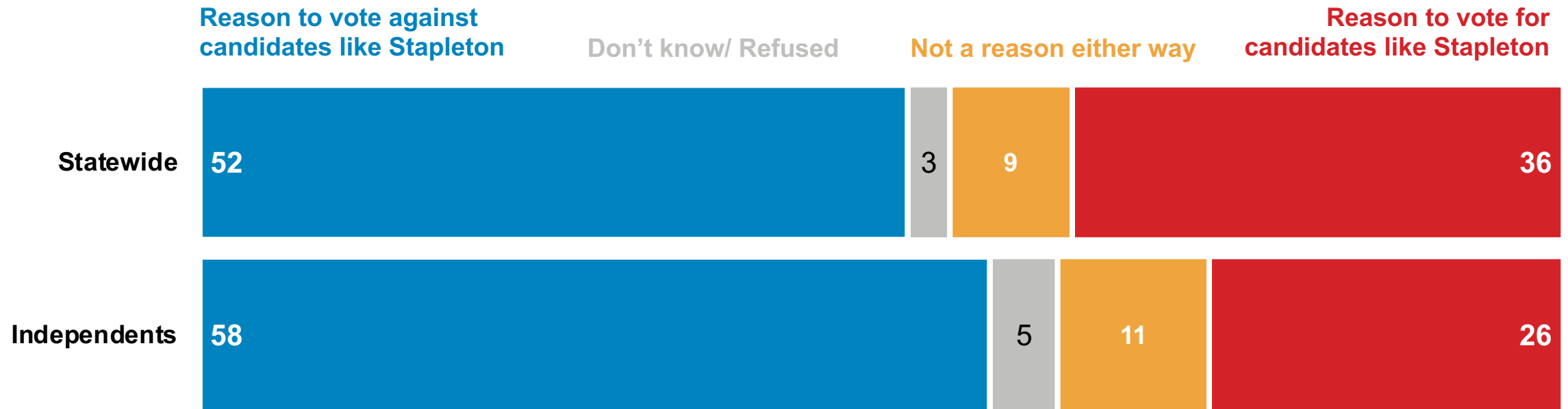


Colorado Exit Poll – CNN (2016)



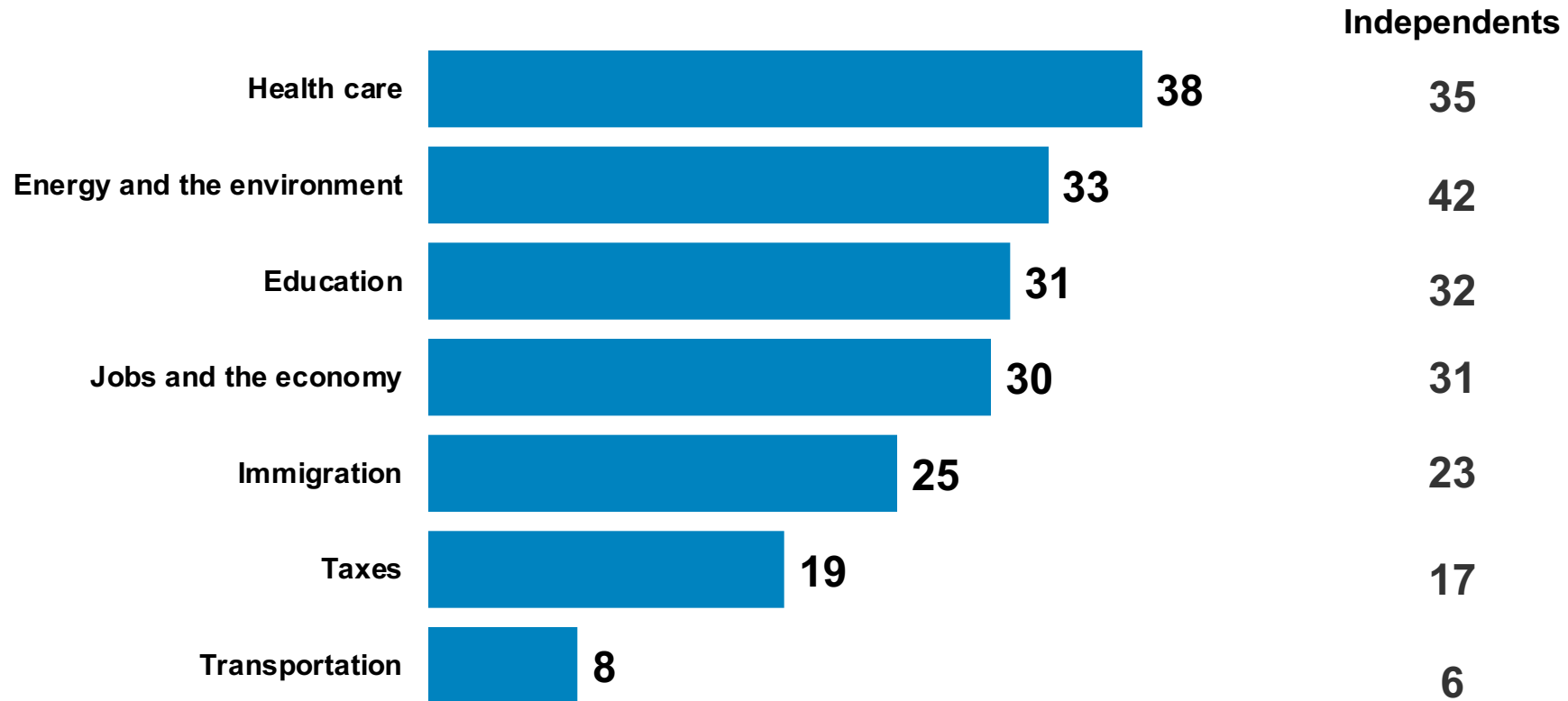
# A majority of voters found Stapleton's similar stance on immigration to Trump as more of a reason to vote against him

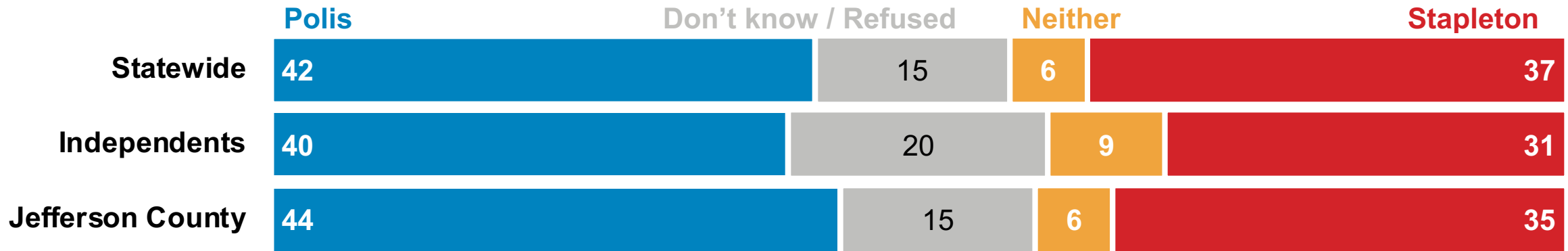
Health care, energy and the environment, and education were the top issues among the statewide electorate. Immigration ranked towards the bottom

Which issue on this list was most important in your vote for Governor?

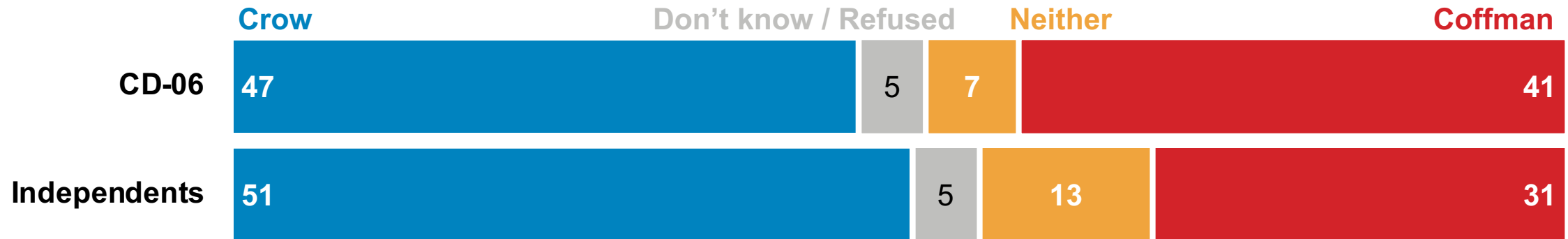


# In both the governor's race and CD-06, voters favored Democratic candidates' stances on immigration

## Who do you agree with more on the issue of immigration? (Statewide)

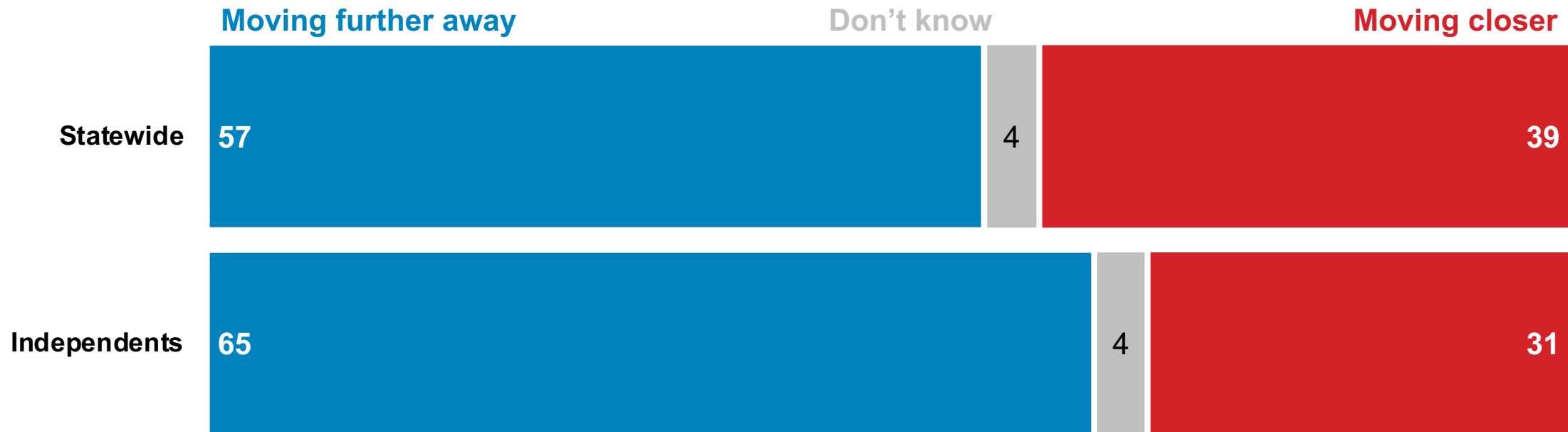


## Who do you agree with more on the issue of immigration? (CD-06)

Would you say that Trump and the Republican Party are moving closer to your political views on immigration or further away?

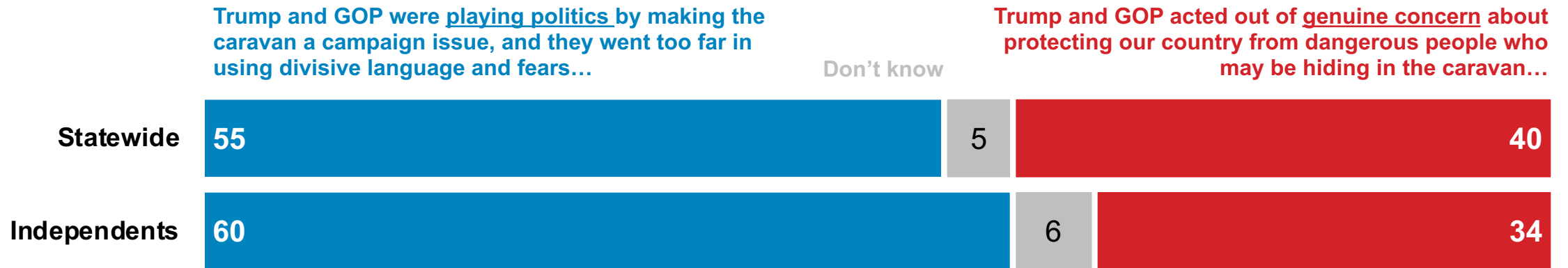




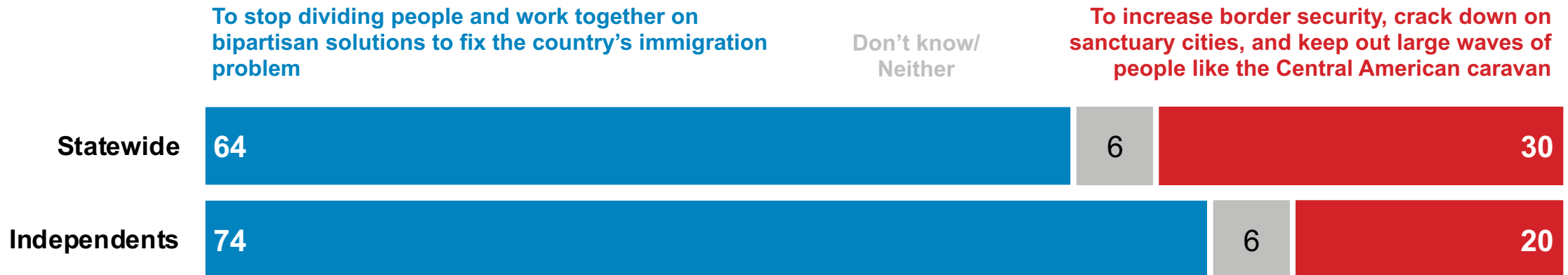


# Colorado saw the migrant caravan issue as “playing politics” and want less division and more problem-solving

When it comes to the ‘migrant caravan’ issue... who do you agree with more? People who say Trump and Republicans...

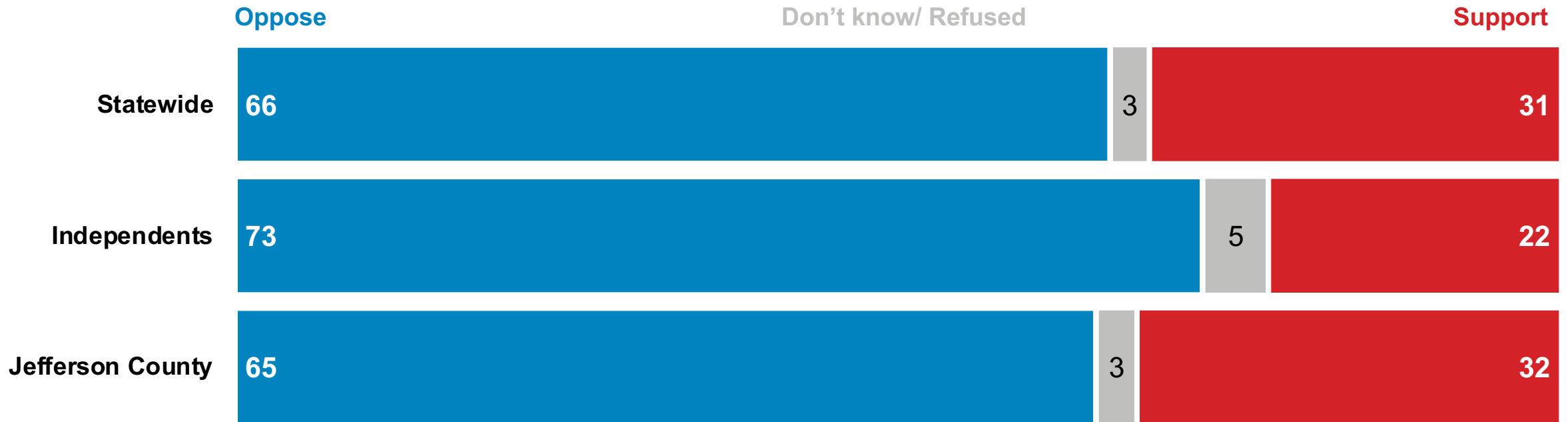


When it comes to the issue of immigration, whom do you agree with more? Those who say the top priority should be...

# What We Did

## Colorado

This survey was fielded between November 5th and November 8th, 2018, among a base sample of 600 voters statewide. Additional oversamples were conducted in Jefferson County, to reach 208 voters in total in the county, and in the 6th Congressional District, to reach 191 total voters in the district. The margin of error at the 95% confidence level is +/- 4.0% for the statewide base sample, and the margin of error on sub-samples is greater.
