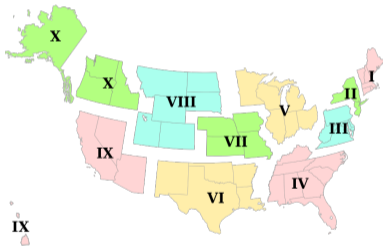
Civiqs polled 3,032 registered voters in the United States from April 15-20, 2021.

The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel. Survey results are weighted by age, race, gender, education, party identification, and standard federal region.

The general design effect due to weighting is 1.12. The survey has a margin of error of 1.9%.

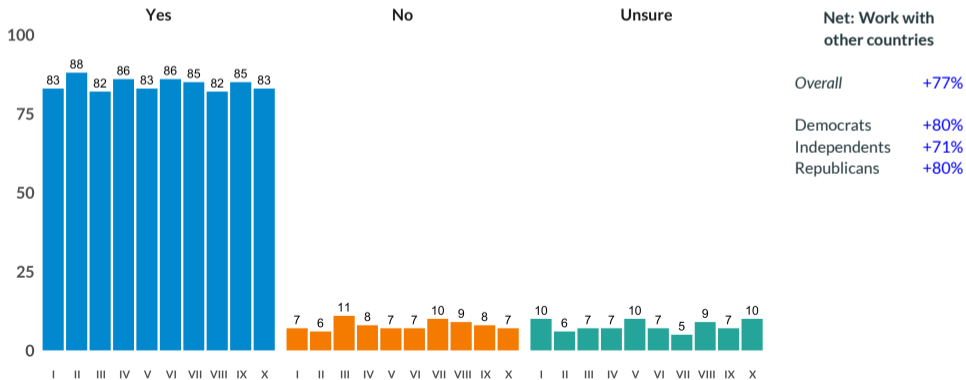

Under what conditions would you be OK with people immigrating to the United States, even if it meant they were crossing the border illegally?

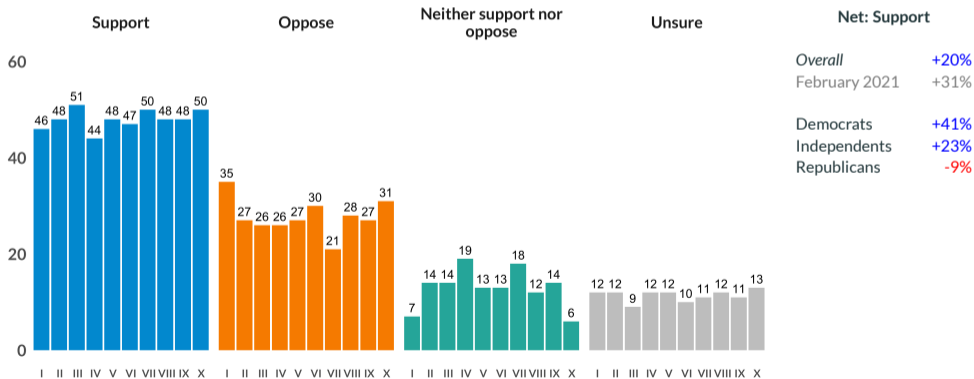

The federal government has invested over \$300 billion on border security and enforcement in the last two decades. Which of the following statements best reflects your opinion about future spending at the border?

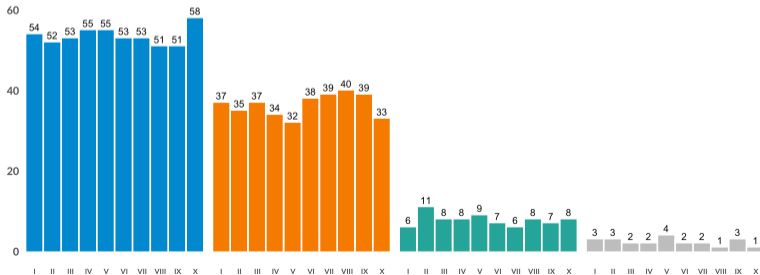
A new and more cost-effective strategy is needed that focuses on smart border management, infrastructure and technology, and working with regional countries to create fair and orderly ways for people to migrate.
