

- They should not be allowed to stay in the country legally and they should be deported.




If DACA overturned, voters want Dreamers to be protected.

Since 2012, a program called DACA has allowed undocumented immigrants who were brought to the United States as children, also known as "Dreamers," to remain in the United States without being deported if they met certain conditions. This year, a federal court may end the DACA program, meaning that Dreamers could be deported.


If that happens, would you favor or oppose Congress <u>passing legislation</u> that prevents the deportation of Dreamers?




Pro-immigrant Candidates win Latino vote

Latino voters: Which candidate do you agree with more




Strong support for protecting undocumented immigrants
