



COLORFUL FALL TREES

Lesson of the Day:

During the fall, trees shed their old leaves. It's a beautiful process, colorful and bright.

We should do this as well--we should get rid of bad habits. Being mean, not listening to your teachers and friends, and thinking only about yourself are all things we can shed to make space for new, beautiful habits. This is how we grow strong- by making ourselves the best we can be.



Materials:

- Colored Pencils/Markers
- Glue
- Red tissue/construction paper
- Orange tissue/construction paper
- Yellow tissue/construction paper



Instructions:

1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
2. Have students trace and color their hand with brown crayon, colored pencil, or marker.
3. Have students color the rest of the picture- grass and sky.
4. Have students tear up either construction paper or tissue paper in fall leaf colors (red, orange, yellow).
5. Students can glue down the paper or crumpled tissue paper to resemble fall leaves, both in the tree and covering the ground.
