



CAUX SCHOLARS PROGRAM - ASIA PLATEAU

Building global leaders as innovators of conflict transformation, trauma healing, restorative justice, and peacebuilding.



This three-week course explores multidisciplinary, integrated methods in peacebuilding, human rights, sustainable development, conflict transformation, trauma healing and restorative justice. Through theory and experiential learning, scholars identify the mechanisms of violence, conflict and trauma and share innovative strategies of resilience and solidarity with one another from their personal and professional contexts. Scholars build practical skills in negotiation, introspection, critical compassion, interfaith and intercultural dialogue, policy, and nonviolent action.

Since 1991, the Caux Scholars Program in Switzerland and India have graduated over 700 alumni across 70+ countries. Scholars are leading change through NGOs, academia, media agencies, the private sector, government, private philanthropic institutions, and intergovernmental organizations.

ACADEMIC DIRECTORS

Led by renowned experts - Dr. Ashok Gladston Xavier, Dr. Florina Xavier, and Dr. David Anderson Hooker - scholars receive an intensive study of lectures, simulations, group exercises, dialogue, debate, field visits, theatre seminars, art workshops, mindfulness meditations, healing circles, and course presentations.
