Good for Employers:


Verifies that professionals have attained a specified level of functioning and understanding about the promotion of IMH and relationship-based practices.

Infant Mental Health competencies and the Wisconsin *Birth to 3*Program practices naturally align in the following ways:




- Demonstration of IMH competencies comprehensively prepares early intervention professionals for how to intervene around social and emotional development and attend to the relationship between the parents/caregivers and their infant or toddler.
- IMH-Endorsement® supports the belief that positive socialemotional development is foundational to other learning, and that healthy development happens within the context of nurturing relationships and environments.

Earning IMH-Endorsement®, particularly at the *Infant Family Specialist* level, recognizes and validates the therapeutic work early interventionists do with families during home visits.

IMH competencies provide a professional development "road map" for acquiring the knowledge and skills needed to attend to the often complex nature of early childhood social and emotional development and parent-child relationships.

IMH-Endorsement® recognizes the value of reflection. When intervening with the dyad, awareness of one's own powerful attitudes and feelings is as essential as the acquisition of scientific knowledge and therapeutic skill. The IMH-Endorsement® process requires integration of ongoing reflective practices. This further prepares professionals to be with families as they experience a variety of emotions, and also creates opportunities for professionals to care for themselves and attend to their own emotions through ongoing reflective practices.
