Getting started...

Have you ever done trust falls and other group building activities? How do you respond to them? Is trusting easy or hard for you?



Start sharing...

Do you find it difficult to trust God when you are in conflict? Why or why not?

Review the sermon together, what were the key points?
What new insights or helpful reminders did you take from Pastor Dawn's message?
What questions did it raise we can discuss together as a group?

How would your feelings, attitudes, or behavior change if you were able to consistently see conflict as an opportunity to trust, obey, and imitate God?

Start connecting...

In the book, *Resolving Everyday Conflict*, the authors put Going to God, with the idea of Overlooking from last week. How do you see these two ideas interrelated?

When could overlooking an offense actually not glorify God?

Going deeper...

Read **Psalms 73** – It is a Psalm of conflict within, and conflict with evil people, and even conflict with how the world seems to be. What do you see in this Psalm to warn of what you should not do, and what does it say you should do?

Start doing...

Read chapter 5 of *Resolving Everyday Conflict*

What are some questions, doubts, or fears that you have in a present conflict?
