Let's Talk Prevention

PREVENTION is a highly effective approach to the national crisis of family homelessness.

Our program "A Future Begins at Home" supports families with children facing imminent eviction from their residences due to an unexpected hardship with critical resources like case management, landlord mediation, and rental assistance. This helps keep families housed and moving forward. To date, Family Promise of Lehigh Valley has helped 61 families remain in stable housing-preventing 128 children from the trauma of homelessness.

Since COVID, many landlords no longer renew yearly leases and instead implement a month-to-month arrangement. As soon as a family starts to struggle and can't pay their rent, they are immediately sent to eviction court where the judge has no choice but to grant the eviction because the family no longer has a lease. This is where Family Promise steps in.

We negotiate with Landlords to stop the eviction and then we help families get back on track. When families face hurdles such as low hourly wages,

shortage of hours, childcare issues, utility costs, or choosing between food and rent, our case manager, David Zinni, helps create a plan with goals for the families that eventually lead them to financial stability.

Kenia fell behind in her rent due to missing work when taking care of her 10-year-old son Jayden, diagnosed with osteosarcoma and frequently had to miss school. Daily, Kenia transported her son to chemotherapy and other doctor appointments, making it impossible to maintain fulltime work. After meeting with our case manager, Kenia joined our prevention program and was able to pay the overdue rent and retain her family's home. Now, Jayden has finished chemo, and, after successful surgery, he is now cancer-free and back to school for the first time in a year. Kenia states that now, "everything is good" and she is thankful for all that Family Promise did to help her with.

With our prevention program, this story and many other stories have a very happy ending.

This month we had the privilege of sitting down with Kathy Kling to ask her what inspires her to give of her time, talent, and treasure for Family Promise.

In addition to her many responsibilities in the community, Kathy is one of the founding members of Family Promise in the Lehigh Valley, a board member, and a host congregation volunteer.

After reading about Family Promise of Carbon County in the Allentown Diocese Newspaper, Kathy started to research if there was a similar program in Lehigh County, telling us "I was so moved by the stories of hope I wanted to get involved." After some research she found that several people were in the process of starting a Family Promise program in Lehigh County.

She attended an organizational meeting at UCC Greenawalds in the fall of 2017 and has been involved ever since. After the program was up and running at UCC Greenawalds, Kathy got busy bringing the program to Notre Dame Church and she and her husband volunteer by spending the night when the church is hosting families.

Volunteering isn't something new to Kathy, she grew up with it. Her parents both volunteered for their church. "I was raised by parents who willingly helped others, so it is second nature to help out when I can. There are so many sad stories. I am glad I am able to help, says Kathy." She is especially happy to see the families she has spent time with at Family Promise gain their self-sufficiency and independence.

Kathy adds, most of the time when people come to us, they have exhausted everything else. They are hardworking people whose lives were derailed by a lost job, a medical crisis or a relationship gone bad. I am happy to see a lot of good people getting involved and helping to make a difference." Kathy is excited that we are taking the steps needed to grow our programs and the number of people we serve. Kathy is not shy about sharing the mission of Family Promise with her family, friends and local businesses and has helped us to raise considerable funding to grow our programs.

At **Family Promise** our families work tirelessly to gain financial independence as they strive to find a permanent home before winter sets in. Their work is supported by a dedicated community of volunteers, congregations, board members, community partners, generous individuals, and the local business community. This Fall, we are celebrating **National Family Promise Week** from October 15th through the 22nd with hundreds of communities across the country. Since 1988, more than one million children and their families have turned to **Family Promise** for assistance with homelessness prevention, shelter, and housing. This year **Family Promise Week** culminates with a **Night Without a Bed** on October 21st. This social media challenge raises awareness and support for families battling homelessness. Participants are asked to sleep anywhere without a bed for one night: cars, a tent, a treehouse, living room floor, or a couch, and post a video or photo and tag us on Facebook. Last year, **Night Without a Bed** raised over \$100,000 to help families across the country.

Every year in America, over 3 million children experience homelessness. These children are 8-9 times more likely to repeat a grade, 3 times more likely to be placed in special education programs, and 7 times more likely to attempt suicide. 42% will drop out of school at some point and 47% suffer from anxiety, depression, or withdrawal. Please help us to raise awareness and support for child homelessness this fall by doing the following:
