



Atlanta is **3.6% larger**,


but growth has slowed.





### Atlanta is **2.1% smaller**,



### **SINCE 1974**

noteworthy legislative changes to the NPUs

**1975** – NPUs fleshed out with criteria and boundary maps

**1979** – added statement of purpose, by-laws requirement, elections and voting procedures, prohibition as political forum

**1988** – officers required to file financial disclosure statements, one vote clarification

**1990** – restriction on actions outside scope of planning and advisory functions

1999 – annual vote on by-laws open to all residents
