FROM REV. DAVID COLBY

I began my ministry at Central on February 1, 2005 as a designated pastor for what was called a four year "live or die" best last chance for Central. I believed at the time that with God's grace and a lot of luck and hard work it might be possible and furthermore, I could imagine that if we succeeded together, new challenges would keep me engaged for eight or ten or even twelve years. It has been such a deep privilege to be the pastor at Central for these sixteen years. It is pretty cool that for such a "live or die" beginning to conclude my time with the second longest pastorate in Central's long history.

I am so grateful for the opportunity to be part of this congregation. I am thankful for what we accomplished together, the steps we took, the mission in which we engaged. I am thankful also for your generosity in overlooking my faults and forgiving my mistakes. We didn't get everything exactly right all the time, but I think we did the best we could to be bold and wise and faithful.

As I have been preparing to leave



Central, I have been remembering key moments from the past and savoring memories. I have been looking at pictures, including one of a young guy standing on the front steps of the church facing Cedar Street for an article in a local newspaper about "the new pastor," to family pictures in the sanctuary with our kids growing taller every Easter and Christmas. I have been remembering Christmas pageants and mission trips and guest speakers

REV. JOHN SEVERSON



TRANSITIONAL PASTOR SEARCH

Central has begun work to call a Transitional Pastor (new term for Interim Pastor) to serve after Rev. Colby's departure.

As with many other jobs, this includes preparing a job posting, receiving applications, conducting interviews and reference checks, and then making a job offer. However, for a pastor the first and last steps must be coordinated with the Presbytery and coincide with a scheduled monthly meeting. Transitional Pastors offer to the congregation and staff the routine functions of: worship leadership and preaching, pastoral care, work with

the session to provide for the life and ministry of the congregation, administrative work including supervision of other staff persons, and staff support for programs and committees of the congregation. In addition, a Transitional Pastor leads a congregation during the transition time, helping the congregation prepare to welcome the leadership of a new installed pastor. Transitional Pastors understand the dynamics of a congregation in transition, including feelings of grief, loss, and, sometimes, relief or anger.

We expect to have a Transitional Pastor in place in February or March and will keep the congregation and staff apprised.

and construction projects and stewardship campaigns and . . . I could go on and on reminiscing. And I have appreciated hearing some of your memories that you have shared with me through phone calls and email messages and cards. I am so grateful for what we have experienced together.

But I have also been thinking about the future for Central. The ability to build on that desire to be in the city for good, the opportunity to grow from a stable financial base, and to utilize a really talented pool of volunteers and leaders will help this congregation enter a new era. I am confident that Central will continue to grow and change and be faithful to God in a new time.

Our Presbyterian tradition provides a good roadmap for how congregations and pastors can thrive during times of transition. Part of what is needed is for real farewells and healthy boundaries when a pastor departs. I pledge to follow the "separation ethics" of the presbytery and support the ministries of a transitional pastor and subsequent installed pastors. This means that after January 3 I will no longer be your pastor. I will not be involved in any way with the selection process of the transitional pastor or the next installed pastor. I will not engage in criticism of those who follow me; nor will I participate in pastoral activities without the prior invitation or request of the

current pastor.

Goodbyes can be difficult. But change can be good for a congregation; I would argue that change is essential for a congregation to remain faithful to the God who keeps calling us to new adventures and new forms of ministry. That was true during the time I was your pastor and that will continue to be true for the future.

Let me end by once again saying thank you. What a privilege and an honor it has been to serve as the pastor of Central. I am grateful to you and grateful to God for the ministry that we have shared.

Stu Siebell served 2020 as the chair of the Personnel and Nominating Committees, always generous with


his time.

Deacons


Linda Berglund has been a force for creative innovations in how the deacons connect to people during the pandemic, including leadership on the Connection Circles initiative.




1:00 – 2:30 P.M. ON ZOOM
