NEVER BE AFRAID TO TRUST AN UNKNOWN FUTURE TO A KNOWN GOD.

- CORRIE TEN BOOM

Corrie ten Boom was a Dutch Christian watchmaker and later a writer who worked with her father, Casper ten Boom, her sister, Betsie ten Boom, and other family members, to help many Jews escape the Nazis from the Holocaust during World War II by hiding them in her home.

Talk about an unknown future! The Nazis could at any moment of any day, break down the door to their home, arrest everyone inside, and march them all (including Corrie and her family) off to a prison camp. This wasn't simple, peaceful protest. This was active insurrection! They were breaking the law and every moment was an uncertainty. Yet, faith was what gave them courage and it was faith that kept them looking forward – even into the unknown. Imagine living from moment to moment in sheer uncertainty and fear.

We don't have to go far to imagine it, at least on some smaller scale. While it's not as dangerous as having armed soldiers barge in and arrest you, we do live with a similar unknown today. With every breath we take, especially when we are around other people, we face the possibility of catching a still very misunderstood disease.

Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God. There is something very calming in those words. To me, this simple reminder brings great reassurance that while the future is always unknown, God is as firm and unchanging as God has ever been.

I'm reminded of a scene from the movie *Jurassic Park*. Jeff Goldblum plays Ian Malcom, a chaos theoretician who has come to Jurassic Park with Sam and Ellie, two paleontologists, to determine the safety of the park. Ian explains chaos theory with the butterfly effect by dropping a drop of water on Ellie's hand. He points out that the water doesn't always fall the same way because of tiny variations and imperfections in the skin. Then both Ellie and Sam jump out of the moving jeep. And Ian says, "That's unpredictability. That's chaos theory."

Even as things don't go as predicted; even as we face a seemingly chaotic future where we can't predict exactly how things are going to go; no matter how chaotic life may seem (and it can be very chaotic at times), God remains constant. God never changes. God is still the same God we knew yesterday.

God has been with us always. God has been where we are headed. Even when it seems that no one could have predicted an outcome, God has known it all along and is waiting there for us.

Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God.

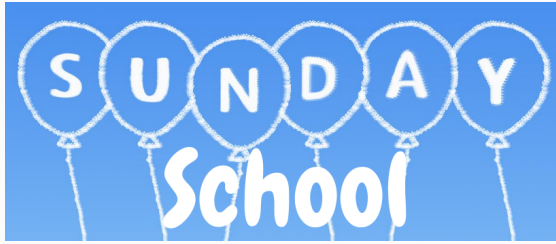
GUIDELINES FROM THE REOPENING TASK FORCE

If you have any questions about the guidelines, or would like to request use of the facilities, please contact the church office.

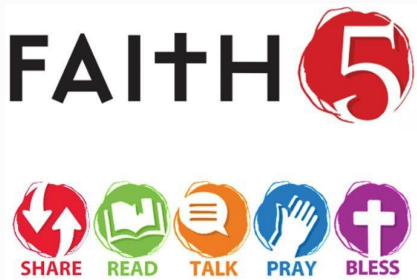
AUTUMN HAPPENINGS



We will begin lessons on **Sunday, September 13th** following Worship. The format will include a Spark Story Bible Story, Faith 5 format (see information below) and a craft/game/project.

These lessons are designed for families and individuals to continue to grow in their faith and Christian learning. You do not need to be a member of Cross to participate – ALL Are Welcome.

The Sunday School videos remain up on Facebook and the church app for later viewing. We will also be coordinating some Zoom Sunday School Family Meetups and will share this information as it is formalized.



FAITH 5 connects church to home, faith to life, and family members to one another in a powerful way. The five steps of the FAITH 5 are:

Step One: Share highs and lows. Name something good and bad you experienced today. Can't think of a personal one? Check out the headlines from the news and teach empathy and compassion for the broader world.

Step Two: Review the Bible Story shared in the Sunday School lesson. (You are welcome to read the story again or find the story in another Bible.)

Step Three: Talk about how the verse relates to highs and lows. Unpack the verse a bit. What does it mean in your own words? How might it relate to where you are today in your highs and lows?

Step Four: Pray for one another's highs and lows, for your family, and for the world. Simply talk to God, thank Jesus for the good, and ask the Holy Spirit for guidance in specific problems.



The 2020-2021 Confirmation classes will begin with a Zoom Family Meeting on **Wednesday, September 9th at 6:30pm**. Students and at least one of their trusted adults are encouraged to attend this meeting.

Classes will continue on Zoom weekly from 6:30pm to 7:30pm. Letters will be sent to all 7th – 9th grade families with detailed information about lessons, expectations, projects, schedule, and Zoom information, including how to link with video and a call in option.

This learning opportunity is open to everyone, so if you know of an individual that would like to participate, please share this information with them and share contact details with Pastor Elizabeth for future information.

Even during a pandemic, we are able to gather together at the Table of our Lord as we receive God's love and forgiveness through bread and wine/juice. ALL are truly welcome to participate in this sacrament.

The process for preparing for First Communion includes a Zoom meeting with the participant, their trusted adult(s) and Pastor Elizabeth to discuss the meaning of communion and connecting it to our lives, supplies delivered to make their chalice, and determine when and details for taking their First Communion.

If your child is ready for their First Communion, please contact Pastor Elizabeth.

Step Five: Bless one another. Trace the sign of the cross on one another's forehead or palm as a reminder that you belong to God and to one another.

Remember that family extends beyond the people we are related to or live in a house with us. Meaningful discussions can happen through Zoom, Facebook, phone calls, etc. You are also welcome to journal or think through these steps. The goal is for ALL Children of God, no matter what age, to continue to grow in faith and Christian knowledge.

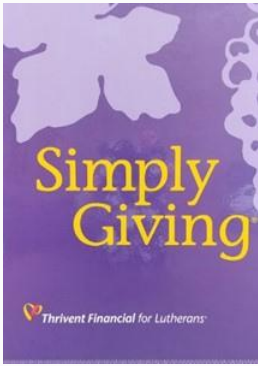

MISSION COUNCIL MINUTES - JULY 16TH, 2020

Present via Zoom: Pr. John Brink, Pr. Elizabeth Lee, Brent Whiteside, Andy Johnson, Terry Erb, Matt Nie, Chuck Stublely, Marie Way & Patty Oldenburg.

6:30 – Meeting called to order by President Brent Whiteside.
Council shared Blessings & Bumpers.

Pastors Highlights:

- **Pastor John** - The Re-Opening Task Force has completed their recommendations for re-opening the church and has concluded their meetings. They have created documents that outline the guidelines for; Worshiping Indoors, Worshiping Outdoors, Worship for the Most Vulnerable, Funerals at Cross, Use of the Building for Cross Organizations/Committees, Use of the Building for Community Organizations, all during the pandemic. The first Worship for the Most Vulnerable service was held on July 5th. It was deemed a success by all. Pastor stated all attendees were very appreciative and felt safe with the guidelines in place. The next service of this type will be held on Sunday August, 2nd. The first Outdoor Worship will take place this Sunday, July 19th at 10:30 on the East side of the building. A baptism will take place. Pastor John met with the bride and groom that will be getting married in August. They have been very flexible and some changes have been made to their plans. He anticipates a fun service. The new secretary, Jessica, has been doing well. Both Anita & Pam have been helpful during the transition period.
- **Pastor Elizabeth** - reported that Cross has \$3376.00 in the Angel Account that will be sent to BASD this week to assist with the summer free lunch program. Thank you to all that have donated. She is looking into Zoom meetings with the Confirmation and Sunday School students in the Fall. Pastor will be participating in a synod webinar to look into digital curriculum. She may possibly recruit some teachers to assist with the Zoom meetings to have more face to face time with students. Pastor is working with the Growing Team in search of ideas. The Affirmation of Baptism service will take place on October 25th. The service will most likely be a pre-recorded virtual one, led by the confirmation students. Service changes may occur before October due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Major Ministry

- **Re-opening the church guidelines discussion.** Suggested changes: 1) Adjust the titles on the two church usage documents to clarify one is for Cross committees the other for community organizations. 2) Add the age clarification of mask usage for children to read “age four and up”. 3) On the Indoor Worship document, the age restricted attendance sentence should read “We ask that those under the age of 8 remain at home.” 4) On the community use document, remove the last statement regarding the organization wiping down the room with sanitizer. Insert a sentence adding the \$40.00 cleaning fee for each use. A motion was made by Chuck, seconded by Terry, to approve the Re-Opening of the Church Task Force documents with the suggested changes. Motion carried. Pastor John stated the task force did not create a document regarding wedding policies. He will make his own guidelines per wedding to guarantee his safety.
- **City voting location.** Council discussed the usage of Cross in November as a polling location. There are concerns about the large number of people that will enter the building and the cost to have Luther Hall deep-cleaned afterwards. A decision will be tabled until next month before a decision will be made.
- **Noah’s Ark.** The opening of Noah’s Ark in the Fall was discussed. Pastor John will ask Director Mary Pumm to put together a comprehensive plan as to what the guidelines of the school will be in response to the pandemic concerns. Questions asked by council members; During school hours, will the BASD guidelines be followed? Will BASD be responsible for the deep-cleaning of the 4K classroom? Will they be using the kitchen? Will the Noah’s Ark classrooms and kitchen, (if used), be cleaned by custodian Bob Remer? Council will be looking for answers to these questions prior to the August meeting.

Minor Ministries

- Pastor John presented a continuing education program he would like to attend. Cross will apply for the Siebert Foundation Grant that will cover the fee for the two year Leading Well program. Brent will sign and submit the paperwork.
- The mini pantry is up and has been continually stocked by our congregation. There is obvious usage by community members. Please continue to spread the word about this ministry to feed our neighbors.
- The Stewardship Team is thinking about our Fall campaign. Amy Warren asked the Mission Council for suggestions for this year's campaign focus. Suggested ideas were; Internal focus – 1) New front entrance doors. 2) Safe space maintenance program. 3) Donation to Cross youth attending the National Youth Gathering. External focus – 1) Continue our partnership with TLC.
- A council committee was chosen to purchase retirement gifts for Pam & Anita.

MISSION COUNCIL MINUTES - JULY 28TH, 2020

SPECIAL MEETING - NOAH'S ARK

Present via Zoom: Pr. John Brink, Pr. Elizabeth Lee, Noah's Ark Director - Mary Pumm, Brent Whiteside, Terry Erb, Chuck Stublely, Marie Way & Patty Oldenburg.

Purpose of the meeting is to address the opening of Noah's Ark in September during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Questions asked, answered by Mary:

- What are other schools in the area doing? The Cathe Center has closed. Plymouth Daycare will be opening and In His Arms Childcare will also be opening.
- Is BASD planning to use Cross for their 4K program this year? Yes, they are planning on 13 children in the 4K classroom with Kris Fisher as the teacher.
- How many children are enrolled for Noah's Ark this Fall? Mrs. Dorn will have nine children in her class. Mrs. Pumm will have five children. There will be extended care. Marlene will have six children in the afternoon. There will be no more than five children for lunch.
- Will parents be allowed in the building? No, student drop-off and pick-up will be outside. Only children and their teachers will enter the building.
- What happens if someone tests positive for Covid-19? Noah's Ark plans to follow the BASD guidelines.
- Will masks be worn by the children and staff? Undecided for the 4 year old class. Most likely not for the 3 year olds.
- When will school start? The 4K class will have a staggered start for the students beginning August 17th. Teachers have already begun to set up their classrooms.

Discussion points:

- Both Mary Pumm and teacher Sue Dorn are willing to open the school.
- BASD must be responsible for the cleaning of the 4K classroom.
- Do Pastor John & Pastor Elizabeth feel there is additional risk for them personally if the school is open? Answer, no.
- If the back half of the building, behind the locked security doors, is used solely for BASD 4K and Noah's Ark, there should be minimal risk to Cross staff and members using the rest of the building.
- Mary will contact Assistant Superintendent of BASD, Connie Zinnen, to get their mask policy, cleaning protocol and closing due to positive testing policy.
- Pastor John advises that no Aspire Tutoring take place this Fall. The use of the building for this program will be reviewed in January of 2021.

MOTION by Terry Erb, second by Chuck Stublely

The Cross Lutheran Church Mission Council will allow Noah's Ark and BASD 4K to occupy our building as of August 2020. Guidelines of usage will be devised by the Cross Re-Open the Church task force and Noah's Ark staff.

Motion carried.

Pastor John will meet with the Re-Open the Church task force. They will:

- Acquire the BASD mask policy, cleaning protocol and closing due to positive testing policy from Mary Pumm.
- Adjust the current funeral policy document, changing the entrance to the church. No longer use the parking lot entrance.
- Create a building usage and policy document for Noah's Ark and BASD 4K, which will include specific cleaning guidelines.
