

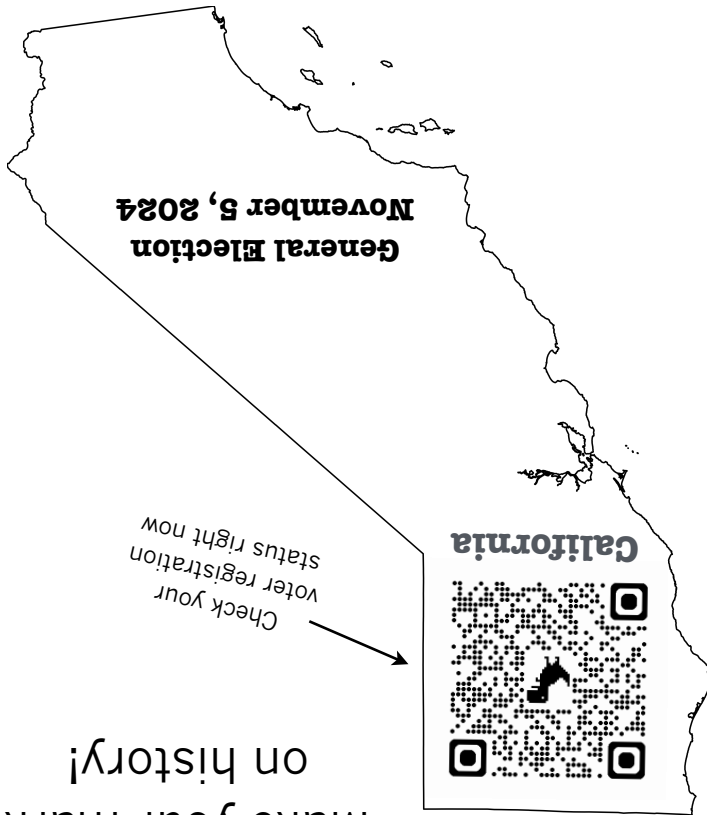

Research your ballot based on the issues you care about

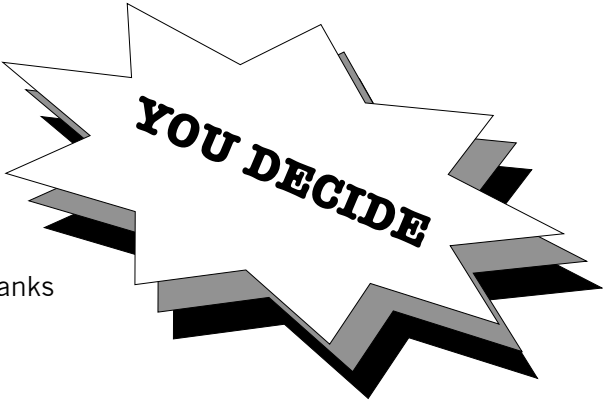
