Communications	access information in ways that best suit you and access information in your own language or access to an interpreter service if required.
Feedback & complaints	be able to easily access a range of mechanisms to provide feedback and complaints.

Respect	be respectful of others, including YACSA staff, volunteers, and other YACSA members.
Information	provide us with accurate, up to date information so we can provide you with the best possible representation, support and member experience.

Participation	to actively participate as much as is practicable in the communications, campaigns and events of YACSA to ensure our work is representative, effective, appropriate and relevant.

Feedback & complaints	tell us how we are performing by providing feedback.
