Since then, she has completed 6 months of one-on-one coaching with Katy Almstrom of <u>Almstrom Financial Coaching</u> and a homeownership course. She is steadily reaching her savings goals and is eager to purchase her home (which is within their current school district) in Spring 2021.

The family is very creative and a home of their own will allow them the space to delve into hands-on projects. Draco loves inventing, constructing, and building while Jacinda is drawn to music and art. Isil, who works full time at Alice Peck Day, has also been devoting more time to her artistic talents since being furloughed from her second job due to the pandemic.

We received a variance to build a duplex at this site, but it came with a zoning restriction we could not meet. We have been working hard to identify the best type of home for the community and the neighborhood and our Board of Directors ultimately opted to **build a single-family home at this site in Lebanon**. We hope to break ground in Spring 2021 and will look forward to building a multi-family home at a different site in the future.
