UDR Background and General Information

Utah Dispute Resolution (UDR) is a private, 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization, dedicated to providing mediation services and training in conflict resolution and mediation skills for residents of Utah. UDR uses trained, qualified volunteer mediators to provide mediation services; a small staff coordinates this effort.

Youth Program

UDR considers the training of today's youth in conflict prevention and conflict resolution skills to be one of our primary goals. Through partnerships with local schools and youth organizations, UDR programs have benefitted thousands of students along the Wasatch Front for over a decade.

Position Requirements & Responsibilities:

- Willing to participate in and complete restorative justice trainings during the internship
- Assist with case work documentation: (Maintain accurate and complete records using UDR's electronic database, following established procedures and protocols)
- Assist with student volunteer programs and other projects
- Assist with lesson planning, facilitating circles, supporting and overseeing peer mediators

Qualifications:

- Has prior experience working with youth
- Is committed to restorative justice principles and practices
- Is enrolled in good standing at a university program in Education, Psychology, Social Work, Conflict Resolution, Peace Studies or related social services field
- Is able to commit one academic year for the internship, preferred; 10-15 hours per week suggested (flexible). *(This is a non-paid internship position)*
- Proficient in using Microsoft Office Suite, including Excel
- Has Spanish language proficiency, strongly preferred

Applicants should send:

1. A cover letter stating the applicant's name, address, phone number and email address as well as statements about the applicant's interest, qualifications and relevant experience.
2. A current resume that includes education and job history.
3. A list of three (3) references with contact information (address, phone number, email): one academic (from a professor), one professional, and one personal.
