Appointed to acting positions were president Alice Kiewit and Amy Mitsuda, who served as treasurer and secretary. Through their capable efforts, HMTA received its charter from MTNA in September 1968 and became the 49th state affiliate. Since its founding, HMTA has endeavored to fulfill the purposes stated in its constitution: "To promote the professional growth and development of its members and to further the art of music by providing programs that encourage and support teaching, performance, composition, and scholarly research."



Dr. Marcin Arendt, Violin

A native of Poland, Marcin Arendt is Professor of Violin at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music at the University of Memphis and a member of the Ceruti String Quartet. Arendt is part of the violin faculty at the Interlochen Arts Camp and plays with the Iris Orchestra, regularly holding the Isaac Stern Concertmaster Chair. Arendt is the co-founder and artistic director of the Memphis in Poland Festival where he leads the headlining band Memphis Mix. Dr. Arendt's playing can be heard on recordings spanning several genres including a series of chamber works by Jacques Castérède on Naxos Records.
