We Have Big News to Share!

If you're hearing from us for the first time, Palm Valley Animal Society (PVAS) is the shelter of record for Hidalgo County and 6 municipalities in the Rio Grande Valley. We've faced some challenges in the last couple of years, including an unsustainable euthanasia rate and significant lack of resources... but things are looking up!




We asked for help last year, and several national animal welfare organizations stepped-up. American Pets Alive was here for a few months, and Best Friends Animal Society—funded by Maddie's Shelter Project in the Rio Grande Valley—has been onsite since July 2018, providing support for shelter operations, business management, and financial planning. During that time we've made many positive changes, including:

We're committed to leading the way toward a no-kill Rio Grande Valley, and with your help we know we'll see the day when no shelter animal is killed due to lack of a home.

INCREASED LIFESAVING NUMBERS



In 2017 PVAS saved 34% of the animals that entered the shelter. 29,800 animals came in that year, and only 10,000 left the shelter alive. We asked for help in 2018, and as of September – with help from the communities we serve and our lifesaving partners — we've saved 70% of the animals that entered the shelter in 2019, an increase of 36%! Our goal is to save 90% or more of the animals in our care. We're on our way to meeting that goal, and with your help we know we'll get there!

Exciting Name Change!

Palm Valley Animal Center is now Palm Valley Animal Society! The Board of Directors voted unanimously in favor of the name change in August 2019. Our municipal facility, formerly Palm Valley Animal Center, is now Trenton Center, and the Laurie P Andrews PAWS Center is now the Laurie P Andrews Center, both facilities of PVAS. Our new identity marks our commitment to lifesaving as a united organization. It's also a celebration of the communities and partners working with us to save lives for good in the Rio Grande Valley!





New Hours of Operation

We're pleased to announce that starting December 1, 2019 both of our facilities will be open from 11:00 AM—7:00 PM, 7 days/week, 365 days/ year. That's an extra hour each day (and three on Sundays), plus every standard business holiday, for finding your new best friend!

Partnership with Maddie's Fund & Best Friends Animal Society



Maddie's Shelter Embed Project in the Rio Grande Valley

Best Friends Animal Society's National Embed Program sends experienced Best Friends staff members to work with partner shelters facing challenges. Data compiled by Best Friends indicated that Texas had the largest "lifesaving gap" in the US (lifesaving gap = animal intake vs animals killed, or "noses in vs noses out"), and Edinburg had the largest gap in the state. They sent specialists in shelter operation to Edinburg to work with PVAS in 2018, and lifesaving increased by more than 25% that year. In 2019 Maddie's Shelter Embed Project provided \$1 million in support to fund

embedded leadership staff members in Edinburg, including an Executive Director, a Shelter Manager, an Operations Director, and a Veterinarian. In addition to financial support for supplies, equipment, and facilities upgrades, Maddie's funding covers the salaries of embedded staff at no cost to PVAS. Going forward, Best Friends development specialists will work with PVAS staff and board members to create a 5-year plan that will increase fundraising to support the organization's ongoing lifesaving efforts after Best Friends departs in 2020.

We asked for help and Maddie's and Best Friends heard the call. In 2018, with their support, we made a commitment to reaching no-kill. The challenges we face in Hidalgo County are more than we can meet alone, however it will take the combined efforts of all the communities we serve to reach our goal. Together we can make the changes necessary to save every animal that can be saved in the Rio Grande Valley!



It's About Time!

RESIDENTS EMBRACE NEW WAY OF SAVING THE COMMUNITY CATS THEY LOVE "It's about time someone did something!"

That was the text received by Community Cat Program (CCP) team members just three weeks after launching their program. CCP Manager Marla Browne says those simple words reflect the wholehearted welcome that community residents across the Valley are giving to a program that saves feline lives and changes human ones: trapping community (often called "stray" or "feral") cats; spaying or neutering and vaccinating them, then returning them to their original locations.

One of those very special caretakers feeds a colony of about 15 cats on Main St. in McAllen. After a few cats (and complaints) came in from that location by animal control officers, CCP team member and native McAllen resident Sarah Kowalski went to talk to the complainant and the caregiver. Sarah returned the first cat spayed and vaccinated to the area, addressed the complainant's issue with the cats scratching up the car and peeing on their front door, and reunited the caregiver with a cat for whom she has cared for fifteen years.

"When cats like these are brought into shelters," says Marla, "we break the human-animal bond that we may not have known existed. And these cats rarely leave the shelter alive. With this program we solve both those problems!"

Initiated in July 2019, Best Friend's Community Cat Program in Edinburg represents an agreement between Best Friends, PVAS, and the City of Edinburg (in addition to the Best Friends/Maddie's Fund Embed Program) that includes \$1.6M to fund staffing, vehicles, and supplies in support of a trap-neuter-return program for the purpose of reducing community cat populations and feline shelter intake. Goals include achieving a 90% save rate for cats and spay/neuter and vaccinations for 16,500 cats. The program is funded through 2022, after which PVAS will assume implementation.
